Hello Archers,

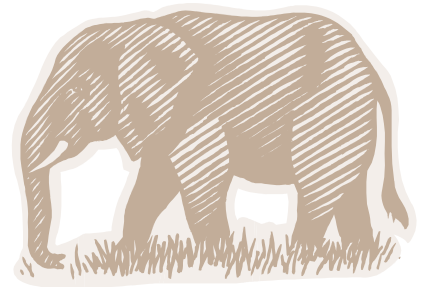

## Legislative Representative News *by Robert Moore*

State Legislation update:

**AB979** Berryhill, T: Hunting/Fishing Local Regulation, passed out of Assembly and sent to Senate, currently in Appropriations Committee.

**AB1423** Berryhill, T: Commercial Hunting License, passed out of Assembly and sent to Senate, now in Appropriations Committee. Amendments to this bill now include: changes to the hunter harassment law, and changes to harassment definitions and added penalties are noted.

**SB589** Harman: Game Hunting, passed out of Senate, amended in Assembly and passed. Sent back to Senate for review, now in unfinished business.

**CA ACA 11** Berryhill, B: Hunting and Taking Game, this is a resolution

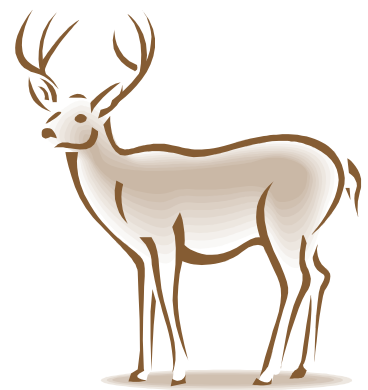
to add right to hunt to the state constitution, this bill is currently in the Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee of the Assembly as of 4/20. No movement.

These are only a few that COHA and CBH/SAA are following but are the most important at this time. The state budget has been passed, so legislation should start moving forward again. Next Nor Cal meeting is Sept. 9 at 7pm in the Maya Clubhouse. Nor Cal Regional activities include; Nor Cal Outdoor 10/11, Maya Stickbow 11/1, Nevada County Turkey Shoot 11/15, Maya Toys for Tots 12/6 and Nevada County Ham Shoot 12/12.

I attended the Placer County Fish and Game Commission meeting Aug. 26<sup>th</sup>. Yep, this is the one that's been in the news. The proposed J17 deer hunt during the 2010 hunting season may

be modified pending approval of the counties that the hunt is in. The PCFGC voted 4-3 and passed this modification and now goes to the Placer County Board of Supervisors. There is misinformation out on this proposal and there is not enough room in this article to address them all. Contact me if you have any questions or need clarification on this proposal.

## Youth & Community *by Robert Moore*

Maidu Interpretive Centers Archery Classes have all been full with a waiting list. No Maidu classes for September. The third Saturday of each month from October through March is the next scheduled sessions from 10am to 12pm.

Archery clinics were organized and held this summer. Each clinic consisted of 5, two-hour sessions held on the mornings of Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The first three sessions were at the sight in range covering consistent shooting form, equipment inspection, archery games, range rules and etiquette to name a few. The final sessions were on the field course covering the different targets and target stakes relating to tournaments and club shoots. Shooting techniques relating to field archery were also covered. Overall the clinics were successful and Maya gained a few new members.

Several Scout groups have scheduled

shooting session for fun or merit badge qualification.

Several archery instructional classes are offered at different times of the year. Youth or adults interested in archery can sign up through the Maidu Interpretive Center to give it a try. See enclosed flyer for more information.

Individuals or groups interested in basic or intermediate instruction, advanced techniques, equipment maintenance/repair or just team building sessions can be scheduled at the convenience of the students and instructor. Maya members receive a discount for any instructional sessions.

I will be starting an After School Archery Program that NFAA has developed. This would be a group class for ages 10 to 18. See enclosed flyer for more information.

Group classes are held at the closest

hay bales adjacent to the 20-yard target butt. Effort is made to accommodate the other shooters while these sessions are in progress. Generally the 20-yard target is closed and a vehicle is parked in front of that target. This gives a visual separation between groups and extends the safety boundaries for operating a safe range. The remaining 30, 40, 50 and 60 target bales are open during that time. This system has been working very well for over 5 years and I would like to thank the club members for their cooperation.

A 4H Instructor Certification class has been scheduled for Oct. 23, 24. Persons interested in the certification can contact Laura or Mike Murphy to register or for more information.

Dry Creek 4H Archery project resumes Oct. 7<sup>th</sup>.
