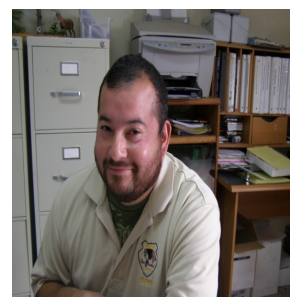
Hello Maya members. As you all know the Polar Bear league is over. We had a good turn out this year thanks to everyone who helped out on Saturday setting up and taking down.

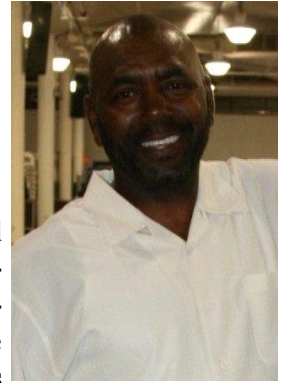

Vice Presidents Report By– Robert Williams



All of you should know by now that our “Around the World Shoot” was cancelled due to severe flooding on the range. On Friday April 13th, that little peaceful, serene looking creek on the property swelled to the point that it washed away several bales (see photos in Dave’s report). Approximately 11 targets on the creek side across from the clubhouse and about seven targets out back under the overpass were swept away by the roaring waters. I’m sure those bales have probably reached the Delta by now. Although we didn’t get to host the shoot on April 14-15, 2012 as planned, I’m sure our new scheduled date of May 20, 2012 will allow for better weather and hopefully a much larger crowd.

Several members attended the rainy work party on Friday and it was at that time a decision was made to cancel the shoot. Therefore, notification phone calls were made to all the clubs in Nor-Cal and NCFAA and several clubs in the Cascade Region as well as an email notification to Maya’s general membership. With the understanding that some shooters might not get the notification the shoot had been cancelled, officers were at the club on Saturday and Sunday mornings to inform them as they arrived. A total of twenty-six shooters came for the tournament and were compensated with a discount coupon of \$10.00 towards the rescheduled shoot.

It took a lot of man-hours and hard work to get prepared for our annual shoot and we were ready a week ahead of schedule. There are too many people to thank individually, so I want to thank everyone who participated in the scheduled work parties as well as the unscheduled weekday work parties. We completed several projects towards range improvement this year and if you haven’t been to the range lately, *“you need to take a look.”*

Because of the truly dedicated members who really care about our club, we are definitely ready for the rescheduled shoot date of May 20, 2012. Emails will be forthcoming regarding a couple of work parties for minor detail work.

What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 7 archery/bowhunting clubs and 2 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA).

What does Nor Cal and CBHSAA do? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is “Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages”. This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.

The California Fish and Wildlife Strategic Vision update:

The Executive Committee has adopted the final Strategic Vision Plan that will be sent to the Legislature and Governor. View any documents at <http://www.vision.ca.gov>

The Fish and Game Commission (FGC) will have adopted this year's big game regulations at their April meeting. Department of Fish and Game (DFG) will have submitted proposals to FGC on upland bird regulations also in April. CBHSAA has requested the archery pheasant season be extended by at least 2 weeks.

2012/2013 hunting license, tags and tag drawings are available now. The deadline to apply for drawings is June 1st.

CBHSAA Alert:

State Senate bill SB1221 has been “gut and amended” from an air pollution bill to now eliminate the use of dogs in the hunting of bears and bobcats. The bill was modified by Senator Ted Leiu and co authored by Darryl Steinberg with the help of the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS). Currently the bill is in the Senate Natural Resources, Water and Parks Committee with its first hearing set for April 24th. Visit CBHSAA web site at www.cbhsaa.net and go to the Legislative link. Information on sending letters, sample letters etc are available to make it easier for you to voice your opinions. Sign up to the ALERT network and CBHSAA will keep you informed on issues related to archery and hunting in a faster time frame than newsletters.

CBH/SAA and Nor-Cal

I would like to take this time to let the members of Maya Archers know how important belonging to CBH/SAA (California Bow Hunters / State Archery Association) is. CBH/SAA is made up of multiple regional sections, with Maya Archers being Region 57 (aka Nor-Cal). The purpose of CBH/SAA is to: 1 - Promote the practice of field archery and to encourage the use of the bow and arrow in hunting all legal game. 2 - To protect, improve and increase the hunting right of bowmen hunters. 3 - Promote the sound management and conservation of all California fish and wildlife. 4 - To unify all local and regional field archery and bowmen hunter organizations of the State of California into one strong association. 5 - To sponsor championship tournaments, to be held in accordance with the Tournament Rules of the Association set by the Board of Governors. 6 - To do all things necessary and proper to carry out the specific purposes of this organization.

A major component of the organization is the Legislative Committee and Fund. All legislation and recommendations concerning use of the bow and arrow, outdoor resources & fish and game related to California archery interest, shall be the primary concern of the CBH/SAA Legislative Committee. Within this committee exists a Legislative Fund that is used to cover the expense of protecting our rights at all levels of government within the State of California.

I highly encourage everyone within organized archery in the State of California to become a member of the CBH/SAA to not only advance archery, but to protect it from those that would like to see it eliminated.

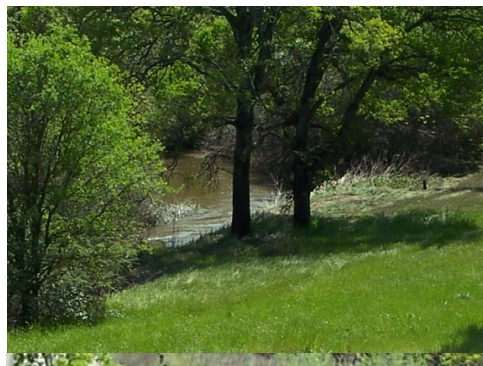

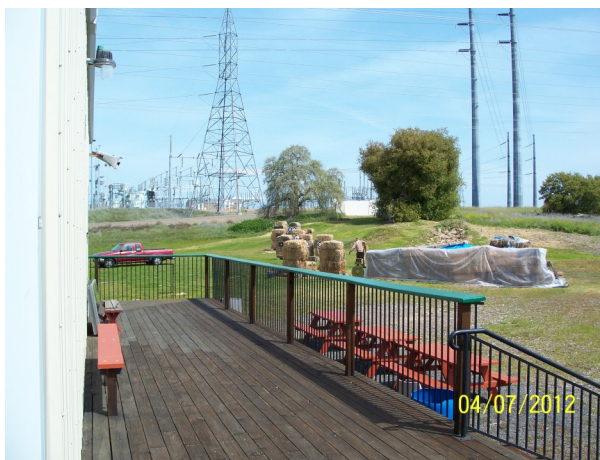

Important dates and fee's to remember for the California Hunting Seasons:

1. California hunting licenses are available now online as of April 15th.
2. The drawing application period deadline is June 2nd, 2012.

Resident license - \$44.85

First Deer Tag - \$21.98

Second Deer Tag - \$36.98

Bear Tag - \$43.46

Drawing application fees:

Pronghorn Antelope, Elk, & Bighorn Sheep - \$8.13 ea.

Fund-raising random drawing tags - \$5.66 per entry. This year there will be a Kelso/Old Mountain Bighorn Sheep tag (New), Northeastern Pronghorn Antelope tag (New), Open Zone Deer tag, and Owen Valley Elk Tag. Fund-raising Random Drawing tag applicants are not required to possess a valid 2012/2013 California hunting license at the time of entry. However the successful tag holder shall possess a valid California hunting license before the tag is issued.

Read your 2012 California Big Game Booklet, prioritize your hunt applications and do it. Get out there hunting this year... Good Luck.
