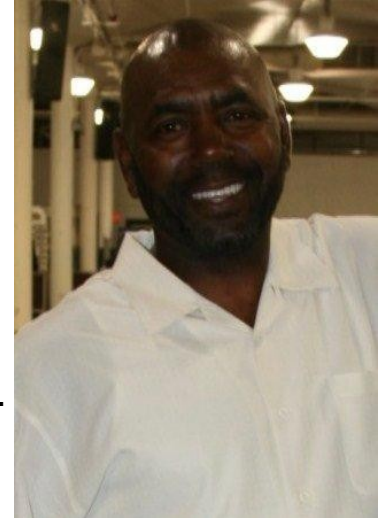

Nor Cal– by Robert Moore 916-723-6792

What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 7 archery/bowhunting clubs and 2 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA).

What does Nor Cal and CBHSAA do? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is “Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages”. This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.



Next meetings, Wednesday Feb. 8th and March 14th, 7pm at the Maya Clubhouse.

The California Fish and Wildlife Strategic Vision Commission have started their work on the possibility of changing how the Fish and Game Commission and the Department of Fish and Game function. Update; comment period on the first draft closed Dec. 16th.

The BRCC and SAG meeting schedule: Jan. 5th, Jan. 20th and Feb. 3rd. Executive Committee meeting schedule: Jan 12th and Feb. 16th. Next is discussion on comments from initial draft review. Next deliverable is the Interim Strategic Vision by Feb. 2012 with a final Strategic Vision completed by July 2012. View the progress and any documents at <http://www.vision.ca.gov/>

Petitions from NFAA and CBHSAA will have been voted on by Maya, Nor Cal and CBHSAA by the time you read this. NFAA will have their annual meeting and vote on NFAA petitions at the Board of Directors Meeting Feb. 2012.

The Fish and Game Commissions next meeting is Feb. 2nd in Sacramento. Agenda items include upcoming mammal regulation changes and update initial petition for the CEQA process.

The winter classes for the Maidu All skills Archery has started. Next class dates are Saturdays Jan. 28th, Feb. 18th and March 17th from 10am to 12 noon. These classes are held at the site in range far right side.

Location will change if raining to an offsite building owned by the Maidu Museum.

During these classes the site in range is still open except for the 20 yard target for safety reasons. Thanks to all the members who have used the site in range while the classes have been held to keep safety as a priority.



Year end information on archery classes for the year 2011:

Total events 19 for 77 hours: 10 Maidu Museum, 2 cub scouts, 1 girl scout, 1 pathfinders, 1 CWA offsite at Birds Landing, 2 CWA (onsite), 1 Cooley Middle School (offsite) and 1 DFG youth clinic.

Total participants, 560: Instructors involved, 15: Other members, 3: Accumulated hours of all involved, 430.

I have been keeping track of events and hours since 2005. Total events to date, 119 for 312 hours, Instructors involved 24, other members 8, Accumulated hours 1,713.

Maya members and instructors also participate in the Outdoor Expo and Youth Fair held in January at Cal Expo. IBEP regional chairman, instructor and Maya member Jim Williams organizes the archery range and scheduling including other archery clubs.

Generally the archery range will have anywhere from 1500 to 2500 individuals shoot during the 3 days the range is open. The hours and participants for this event are not included in the statistics above.

Proposed By-Law Change

At the general meeting of Maya Bowhunters on 1-3-12, the Board presented the below By Law change to the general membership.

The Board recommendation was passed by the general membership to read as follows.

Existing By-Law

ARTICLE 2

Membership Requirements, Club Rules, Credits, Dues

Membership Requirements:

B. All Members must participate in one (1) work party, and one (1) special event to meet the equivalent of 12 hours of work per year.

i. Life Members are exempt.

ii. Non Working Membership and Associates are exempt.

iii. Board of directors can waive work requirements for members with physical disabilities or other factors.

Proposed By-Law Change

ARTICLE 2

Membership Requirements, Club Rules, Credits, Dues

Membership Requirements:

B. All Members must participate in one (1) work party, and one (1) special event to meet the equivalent of 12 hours of work per year.

i. Life Members are exempt.

ii. Non Working Membership and Associates are exempt.

iii. Board of directors can waive work requirements for members with physical disabilities or other factors.

iiii. Members 70 years and older will not be required to attend the 2 yearly mandated work parties.
