One useful tool is On X maps on your cell phone... this provides valuable information for a wide variety layers that identify private property, historical burns, trails, State lands, National Forest and several other layers. You have the choice of Satellite, Hybrid (Satellite/Topo), or Topo views. Download your maps to your phone and have them with you in the field. When in an area without cell service you can go into Airplane mode, and it uses your phones GPS to accurately pin-point your location without using up the battery!

Markup you map with waypoints, track your progress... it all there. It will sync up to the cloud and when you log into On X from your computer you can view you map, waypoints, & tracks. Best of all you can ditch your handheld GPS and lighten your load and not hav-

ing to spend money on the map chips that have to be updated every so often. I've used this here in California, Arizona, Utah, & Wyoming ever since they came out with the phone app. And for you elk hunters... it's the only way to go. The Broadhead & 3D league ends Saturday, July 28th and after completion of shooting that day our BBQ & Awards will be held at noon plus the winch raffle winner will be drawn at that time. Someone is going to win a Warn VR8 winch (8,000 Lbs., 94' of 5/16" steel rope).

And to all you members who are successful in taking big game this season, be sure to send in a photo of your of your animal... whether it be antelope, caribou, bear, deer, elk, moose, & sheep. I know we have members in the club that travel all over in pursuit of big game. Just email a photo (respectful, clean & posed) to me or the clubs email and you will be entered into our Club Big Game Awards.

Our membership renewal has gone very well so far and I would like to thank all those that have renewed their membership promptly a big thank you. Currently we have renewed 262 members in the short time of one month. This is the best response in my memory over many years and hopefully will have 75% of last year's total active members of 428 by August 15th. Every year we have a percentage of members who don't renew at all for one reason or another. Please keep in mind that if you have not renewed your membership by August 15th and have any work or target credits, they will be lost and you will be responsible for the full membership dues for 2018/2019 year. Last year we gave out \$1,890 in work party credits that would reduce your annual dues. This amount does not include the credits given to target owners. So in the coming year, you can reduce you annual dues by attending Work Parties & working our Special Events (Around the World Open & Stickbow Classic) and not be penalized, resulting in doubling your dues for Adult, Family & Senior memberships. Non-Working Adult/Family, Non-Working Senior, & Associate members are exempt from Work Parties and Special Events.

They represent the areas 9 archery/bowhunting clubs and 3 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). What do Nor Cal and CBHSAA do for Archery or Bowhunting? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is "Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages". This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.
