

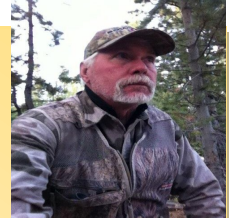

I'm going to go off the rail in this article... Some of you use Google Earth, OnX, or GoHunt to doing your E Scouting from your desktop. I'm going to let you in on another way to get more in depth information when selecting your area. It involves using 'Google Scholar'... that's right; you can bring up scientific articles compiled by wildlife biologist. It's simple as starting Google and typing in 'Google Scholar' on the search line. From there you can search for information about various species (deer, antelope, elk, & etc.). There's tons of data to be found about the game your hunting. Research data can be brought up about their home range, migration routes, forage in areas and habitat conditions. For example, type 'Elk Habitat in Wyoming GMU 95'. This will return articles, data, & maps relating to your search criteria. Scroll down and find an item that relates to what you're looking for and click on the link. You will be surprised at what you find out. You can tweak you search criteria to further refine what of interest that may help you gather more information about the area you intend on hunting. I'm told this is called the Science of Scouting. But as always it's would be a great benefit to call the Biologist in that area and ask questions. But be sure that you have made up a list of question that you want to ask before calling. Be specific in your questions and you will be surprised what you can learn.

We also had a very nice raffle.

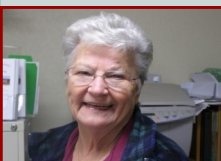

Nor Cal

What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 9 archery/bowhunting clubs and 3 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). What do Nor Cal and CBHSAA do for Archery or Bowhunting? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is "Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages". This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.

The next Nor Cal meeting will be Wednesday June 12th at Maya's clubhouse; 7pm. NFAA Petitions will be discussed provided the president received them. The state Marked 3D championship will be at Cougar Mountain Archers June 16th piggybacked with their open 3D shoot. The state Broadhead Championship will be at Tejon Ranch May 18 and 19.

Region archery club tournaments West Valley Bowhunters in Orland April 7th, R100 in Fresno April 13 and 14, Maya club 3D club championship April 21st, Paradise bowhunters April 28th at West Valley Archery Range in Orland and Redding Trail shoot May 3 – 5 in Redding.

The next California Fish and Game Commission meeting (CFGC) will be held April 17th in Santa Monica.

2019/20 mammal regulation changes will finale by vote. Bowhunting changes listed on agenda included going from casting a hunting arrow 130 yards minimum to a draw weight minimum of 30lbs for big game and removing regulation to allow carrying a firearm during an archery only season or archery only tag. The firearm regulation change would not affect deer due to deer regulations are primarily fall under Fish and Game Code established by the State Legislature. Note; if you have a deer tag in possession while carrying a concealable firearm during archery season or under an archery only tag you could be cited regardless if you are primarily hunting another species.

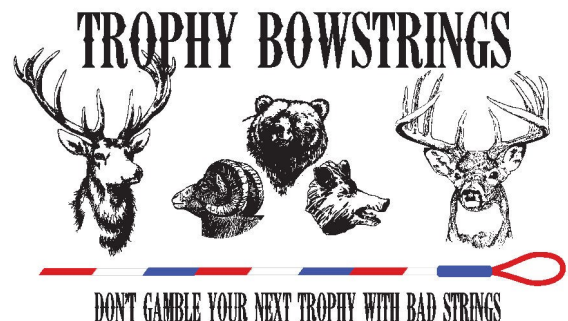
