California Outdoor Heritage Alliance is active with California bills that could affect hunting, fishing, firearms and/or hunting land. Following is a list of COHA sponsored legislation and where it's at in the process: Updated Nov. 2010.

AB979 Berryhill, Hunting/Fishing Local Regulation. Vetoed by Governor

AB1254 Berryhill, Fish and Game Commission meetings. Signed by Governor

SB1058 Harman, DFG dedicated accounts. Signed by Governor

Other Supported legislation related to hunting:

AB1965, Yamada, Agricultural land funding to Williamson Act. Signed by Governor
AB2427, Berryhill, Hunting and Taking Game Prohibition.

Currently in Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife

ACA11, Berryhill, Right to Hunt. Currently in Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife

Not supported Legislation unless amended:

AB2376, Huffman, Fish and Wildlife Strategic Vision. Signed by Governor
AB2223, Nava, Wildlife Management Areas, non toxic shot. Failed passage

The 2 year cycle for legislation ends this year. New legislation needs to be introduced by the end of January and will have 2 years to complete.

State elections were held and only a few new legislators were elected., the remaining are incumbents in their districts. A new Governor and Attorney General will play a role in what and how wildlife related issues are approached and who manages the Natural Resources Department. The biggest item for our state legislators and Governor to address is the Budget.

Congress had drastic changes in Washington D.C. New legislators for the House and Senate will have a daunting task of righting the economy. Current federal legislation related to public land being designated as Wilderness Areas would limit access to users. It will take several months before we know the direction Congress takes.

CHB/SAA and NFAA members, California Bowmen Hunters/State Archery Association annual meeting will be held in Ontario, January 21-23. This year the Big Game Banquet takes place Saturday with Fred Eichler as the guest speaker.

CBH/SAA petitions (No NFAA this year) will be voted on at Maya's general meeting Jan.4th.
