Club 3D Championship April 16th and 17th—PARTICIPATION RULES

1. Club 3D Championship will be held with the "Around the World" Open on 4/16 and 4/17.
2. The Club Championship is for Members only!!
3. Members MUST volunteer for a minimum 4 hour shift at this year's "Around the World" Open.
4. Members must pre-register for the Club Championship on either Sat. or Sun. and then sign up to work the Open on the other day.
5. Members must sign up prior to Friday April 15th.

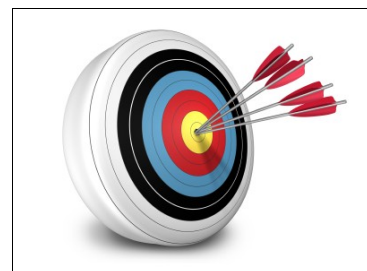

Donations are coming in, and look very promising. We should have a decent raffle for the " Around the World" Shoot.

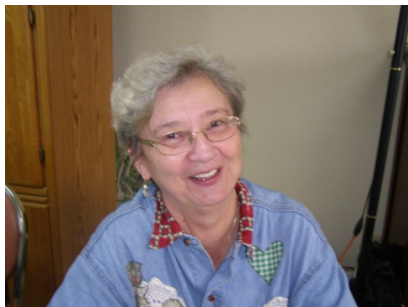
There will be a raffle ticket drawing for our Award Banquet, March 19th. Everyone that participates will be given a ticket, just for participation.

VP TARGET REPORT: DENNIS DEMPSTER

Hello fellow Maya Archers. I hope everyone is doing well and has had a chance to come out and shoot the Polar Bear League. We already have 4 weeks in and the turnout has been great. Just a reminder that we will be starting regular work parties to get ready for the " AROUND the WORLD" shoot in April and can use as much help from fellow members as we can, to prepare Maya for it's big event. A few hours help from everyone adds up quick and makes for easy workload, plus it helps reduce your yearly membership renewal. Our 3D target repair has been going great, and big Thanks to Paul, Carlos, Don and everyone else that has been helping. I know everyone will be impressed with the quality repair work.

Unfortunately, I need to bring up a couple issues regarding our range and targets. 1st As a reminder UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES are BROADHEADS to be shot at our TARGET BALES. If you wish to shoot broad heads to tune your bow, please bring your own target to shoot into. Broad heads damage the hay bales much more than field points, and secondly someone has left their broad head in the 60 yard bale on the sight in range. I know because one of my arrows was damaged from the left behind broad head (1 inch 4 blade) based on impact in target face. I would hate for anyone else to have their arrows damaged because someone refuses to follow simple rules. 2nd We have had target faces and pins disappear from the range. These targets are here for everyone to use and not to be taken home for personal use. If you wish to have your own targets they are for sale at Wilderness and Sportsman Warehouse for a few dollars.

VP TARGET CON'T

3rd- Target faces on the range are placed on the center of bales for a reason. This allows for high and low misses to have something to hit. Please leave them there. Recently the Hunter target on #4 was moved to top of bale and shot at. This is NOT SAFE, as a missed arrow will go over bale and if it goes into PG&E property it will damage their equipment or worse injure or kill someone. That is a liability this club and you as an individual do not want. I ask all of you to help by telling anyone you see taking targets or moving them to unsafe locations, that it is not acceptable, and to notify myself or any other board member of the offending individuals. 4th- I'm sure you have noticed the vinyl target faces appearing more on the sight in range now. Please feel free to provide any feedback and shoot them up. So far they have shown to take quite a beating and still look intact at distance.

CBH/SAA and NFAA members, California Bowmen Hunters/State Archery Association annual meeting was held in Ontario January 21-23. This year the Big Game Banquet took place Saturday Jan. 22 with Fred Eichler as the guest speaker. New state record Antelope and Non-Typical turkey were part of the 2 year scoring period. Next year is the Hall of Fame Banquet to be held in Stockton. All CBH/SAA petitions passed.

The State Broadhead Championship will be at the Tejon Ranch down by Bakersfield on Memorial weekend.

Mammal regulation changes presented to the Fish and Game Commission from DFG February 3rd meeting included two new Big Horn Sheep hunt areas, increase the bear take from 1700 to 2000 and align archery bear season with archery deer seasons in zones where bear can be taken. For deer and elk only changes to quotas were presented, no new hunts will be accepted till 2013. The next two FGC meetings will be for public comment then the Commission will make its final decision. You can view the proposed documents on either the DFG or FGC web sites.

BLM property called Kanaka Valley is going through its Land Management planning process. The last meeting held Feb. 3rd resulted in some form of restricted hunting to be determined at future meetings.

Nor Cal has officer opening for Vice President. First Vice President shall assist the president in all the presidential duties and in the absence of the President, serve in his/her place. He/She shall supervise the annual Nor-Cal Outdoor and Indoor Championships. He/She shall maintain records of and be responsible for all trophies and awards other than hunting awards and be a member of NFAA.

Jim Williams is the VP of Hunting for Nor Cal. The small game species list is being updated to conform to DFG regulations.

Next Nor Cal meeting is March 9th at 7pm in the Maya Clubhouse.

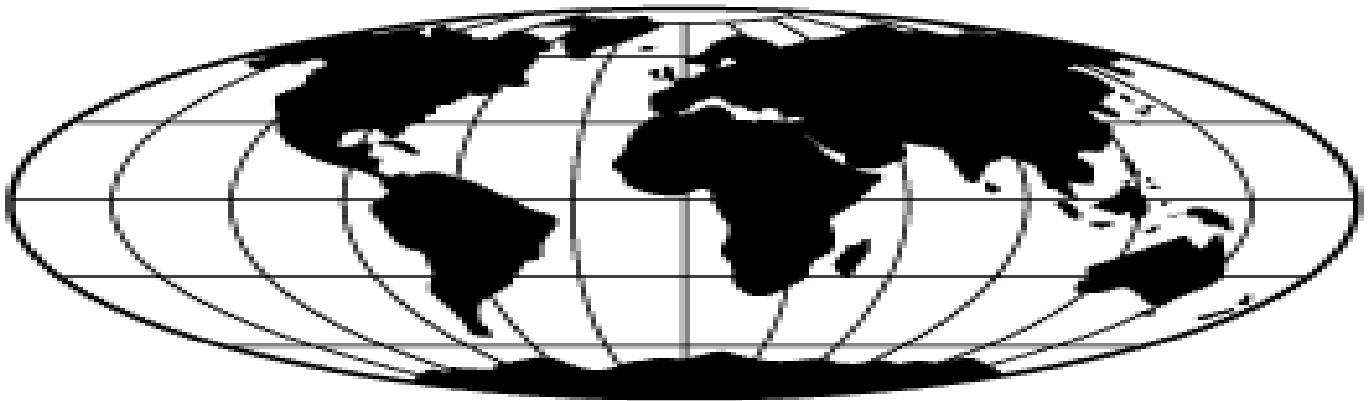
A Big Thanks to all the individuals who work the booth and to Jim Williams for organizing and running the archery range.
