The State Broadhead Championship will be at the Tejon Ranch down by Bakersfield on Memorial weekend.

Mammal regulation changes presented to the Fish and Game Commission from DFG February 3rd meeting included two new Big Horn Sheep hunt areas, increase the bear take from 1700 to 2000 and align archery bear season with archery deer seasons in zones where bear can be taken. For deer and elk only changes to quotas were presented, no new hunts will be accepted till 2013. You can view the proposed documents on either the DFG or FGC web sites. Mammal regulation adoptions will take place May 4th and 5th in Ontario. Let's hope everything passes.

BLM property called Kanaka Valley is going through its Land Management planning process. The last meeting held April 7th resulted in the BLM will make the final decision on hunting for that property.

Next Nor Cal meeting is May 11th at 7pm in the Maya Clubhouse.
