### Presidents Report– Carlos Rodriguez 916-201-6798

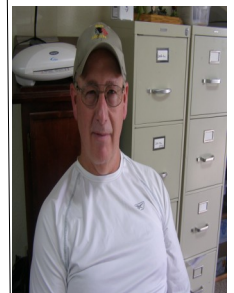

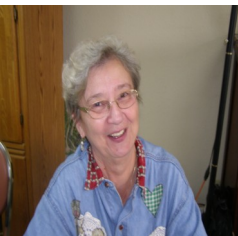
### **Publicity Report– Paul Cordingley 916-723-9471**

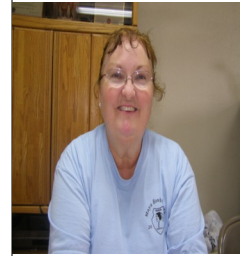
## **Treasurer's Report– Olivia Lawson– 916-991-5350**

Yes, that big show is coming up again, and I need your help! The San Mateo show was cancelled this year, so we can expect more people at the Sacramento show. Our needs have not changed, we need funds & volunteers.

Maya is providing the equipment, and Wilderness Archery is ( as always) is providing lots of targets & incidentals for the show. Our big expenses are dollar bills and the balloons to put them in. I MUST purchase the thicker balloons ( so the kids can't see the dollar bills inside) otherwise EVERYBODY targets THAT balloon! We go through about \$100.00 in ones over the threedays we are there, and seven or eight hundred balloons ( at \$12.00 per hundred). We put one dollar in every tenth balloon. Trico welding provides a tank of gas to fill said balloons, saving many pairs of lips.

As before , the volunteers are what makes this a success. I like having at least 10 people per shift, to allow for breaks, and to keep our BIG lines moving. WE get A LOT of kids... I, as always provide the volunteers tickets to get in, but cannot pay for their parking (\$10.00/per car). I would LOVE to have MORE Nor-Cal Clubs out there ( to promote their clubs we put up banners, put out applications, and I like EVERYONE to wear their club shirts & jackets). Maya, Yolo, Laguna, Wilderness JOAD have ALL provided personel to us. Lodi, Yahi, Joe Becker, and Dick Vermillino have covered a good distance to help, and continue to do so. If a club cannot provide 10 or more members, I will plug them in where I need them. With paying for your own parking, I strongly suggest carpooling. I will fill slots on a first come, first serve basis, requesting that all show up 30 minutes before your shift, the hours & needs are as follows:

## Nor Cal

CBH/SAA and NFAA members, California Bowmen Hunters/State Archery Association annual meeting will be held in Ontario January 21-23. This year the Big Game Banquet takes place Saturday Jan. 22 with Fred Eichler as the guest speaker.

CBH/SAA petitions (No NFAA this year) are in the clubhouse for members review and will be voted on at Maya's general meeting Jan. 4<sup>th</sup>.

A new legislative session at the state capitol will start in January. Generally by the end of January all new legislation must be introduced in either chamber. The state budget should take up most of their time for a while but expect some representatives to introduce bills that will affect your fishing, hunting and shooting, some good and some bad.

Mammal regulation changes if any will be presented to the Fish and Game Commission from DFG at the February meeting. The state budget mess affects this process too. Proper documentation (CEQA report) costs a lot of money. The process and EIR reports must withstand court challenges. CBH legislative committee has submitted minor bear regulation changes and a couple of new deer hunt proposals to DFG for consideration.

Nor Cal has officer openings for President, Vice President and Recording Secretary.

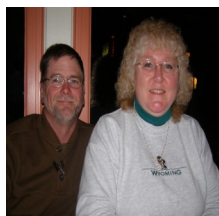
Office description for President include presiding at all meetings of the Nor-Cal Board of Governors, appoint all committees, act as field captain at all Nor-Cal tournaments and perform the usual duties of his/her office and must be member of NFAA.

First Vice President shall assist the president in all the presidential duties and in the absence of the President, serve in his/her place. He/She shall supervise the annual Nor-Cal Outdoor and Indoor Championships. He/She shall maintain records of and be responsible for all trophies and awards other than hunting awards and be a member of NFAA.

The Recording Secretary shall be in charge of taking the minutes at all the meetings and mailing copies to each executive officer and the newsletter editor within 7 days of the meeting and be a member of NFAA.

Anyone interested in any of the positions should attend the next Nor-Cal meeting.

Next Nor Cal meeting is January 12<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in the Maya Clubhouse.
