will heading in search of the Majestic Elk, including myself. I would like to wish all of us a safe and success hunt. Please be sure to take pictures and send them to us. Also don't forget to submit your animals to Dave Baker for the club Big Awards. The scoring sheets for Big Animals can found on the Maya website. Next up for the Club is the Stickbow Classic on Nov. 6th. The Club will need help between now and then to get the range ready. There will be additional work parties in October to prepare. The next event after the Stickbow is the Club Field Target Championship on Nov. 13th. This year Maya will be hosting the Nor Cal Field Championship at the same time. Maya members can participate in both for only a small additional entry fee. The Club will also need help setting up the range for this shoot. We did this same combined shoot 2 years ago and we had a good turnout of 60+ shooters. It will be fun so come out and join us for a fun shoot. See you out at the range.

The last thing I want to talk about is the Range Rules. As Members we are obligated to follow the rules of this Club. There are 4 things I want to remind you of: 1) the speed limit on the road to the target range is 15 MPH. We recently posted a sign at the beginning of the road. It reads 15 MPH. I have seen many members driving in and out at speeds in excess of that limit. It creates a severe dust hazard this time of year and is a safety concern to other drivers and the bike trail fence. Please slow down. 2) Broad-heads are being shot at the targets on the lower range, particularly the 60 and 80 yard target butts. This practice is forbidden and clearly stated in the Range Rules. There will be no

warnings for this violation, if you are caught, you will lose your membership. 3) Parking on the lower range is in the designated areas before target bale #1 and at corner by the outhouse by the overpass. There is NO PARKING on the road between those 2 areas and no driving past the overpass to back area unless authorized during a work party. 4) Lastly, the issue of bringing pets onto the range. Recently, some members have been seen with their dogs out on the range. Since the Range is on City of Roseville property we are required to comply with

times. This is also a safety concern, no matter how well trained it is still an animal and behavior in an unfamiliar environment is unpredictable at best. We would not want your pet to be accidentally shot, because it ran in front of a target. Please consider these rules are in place for safety and the benefit of all members. If a member continues to violate these rules the Club will take action up to and including loss of membership.

The California Fish and Wildlife Strategic Vision Commission have started their work on the possibility of changing how the Fish and Game Commission and the Department of Fish and Game function. The big issue is funding for DFG. This Commission has until July 1, 2012 to submit its vision to the Legislature and Governor for consideration.

Both the Upland Bird and Big Game advisory Committees met to go over funding projects for the upcoming calendar year. Habitat enhancement with matching dollars from Conservation Organizations had the most bang for the buck. Scientific data surveys and counts are necessary under management plans to sustain tag quotas and seasons. Pig tag monies now go into the Big Game account to be used for projects.

CBH/SAA had a small archery range set up at the COHA Legislative Sportsmen Caucus Shoot in Rancho Cordova Aug. 23rd. Several state legislators and staff shot bows and arrows at FITA and 3D pinup targets. Fellow archery instructors Jim Williams and Carlos Rodriguez assisted on the range. Everyone seemed to enjoy the added archery range to the existing shot gunning stations. COHA had a good response to our efforts.
