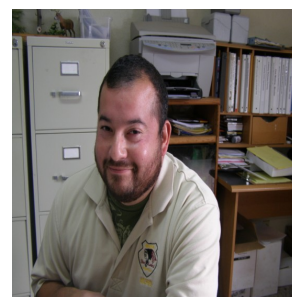

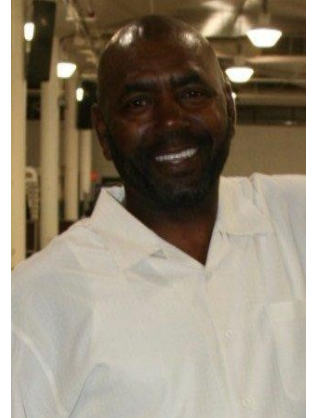

## **NOR CAL/COMMUNITY REP** **-ROBERT MOORE**



What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 7 archery/bowhunting clubs and 2 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA).

What does Nor Cal and CBHSAA do? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is "Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages". This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.

The California Fish and Wildlife Strategic Vision update:  
The BRCC and SAG meeting schedule: The Executive Committee meet Feb. 16<sup>th</sup> to accept and start discussion on the recommendations from BRAC and SAG. The next deliverable is the Interim Strategic Vision by the end of

Feb or first of March with a final Strategic Vision completed by July 2012. View the progress and any documents at <http://www.vision.ca.gov/>

The FGC and DFG are in the process of updating wildlife area regulations mostly to simplify regulation language. DFG big game species coordinators are in the process of updating their management plans so future quota's and hunts can be substantiated by recent scientific data. No new hunts are being proposed until those documents are completed. DFG will have big game raffle tags available again this year, one deer, one elk, one antelope (new) and one sheep (new).

Petitions from NFAA and CBHSAA have been voted on by their respective boards. No major changes from CBHSAA, haven't received NFAA's final board vote as of writing this article.

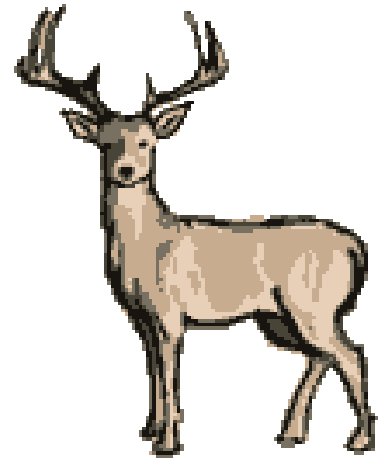
