We had a good turn out last year and hopefully we can have a good year again. Hope to see you all there.

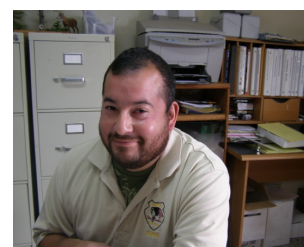
Just a reminder that the Sportsman Expo at Cal Expo will be January 10-13 so save some money because you might find what you are looking for.

We do have some vacant spots if you think you might be interested please contact myself for more information.

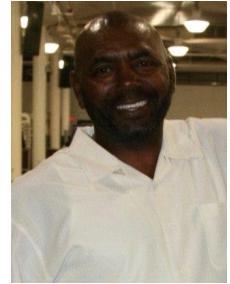
Well that's all for my part we would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Basic Archery Instructor (level 1) can be done in one day and you don't have to have archery experience. Maya members do earn work party credits when enough hours have been earned.

What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 7 archery/bowhunting clubs and 2 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA).

What do Nor Cal and CBHSAA do for Archery or Bowhunting? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is “Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages”. This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state area reps and each region group has one legislative representative.

Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters. Future meeting dates, Dec. 12th and Jan. 9th, 7pm at the Maya Clubhouse.

Petitions from NFAA and CBHSAA to change bylaws, tournament rules etc will be discussed at the Dec. meeting and voted on at the Jan. meeting. Results will be taken to the CBHSAA annual meeting January 25th – 27th. The CBHSAA annual meeting and Big Game Banquet will be held in Santa Ana this year.

The CBH/SAA Legislative Committee is holding a hunting opportunity drawing with the proceeds going to the Legislative Defense Fund. A 7 day African plains game adventure for one hunter and one observer, 5 day self guided Blacktail deer hunt for 2 hunters are just a few of the available hunts. I have tickets that can be purchased and/or for more information just contact me at moorerobt@surewest.net

The Fish and Game Commission (FGC) adopted a change in the upland bird regulations in regards to Turkeys. The fall season will now be 30 days long with a two bird limit. FGC also started a candidate listing of the gray wolf in regards to the California Endangered Species Act. This will be a one year study to evaluate the listing proposal. Jim Kellogg has been reselected to the FGC with Senate confirmation hopefully happening in December.

I know, I keep hounding you every year, but the ISE Show will be here before you know it. The show is one week earlier, so it WILL NOT be the same weekend as the CBH meeting (YAY!!!). Our needs haven't changed, we need funds AND volunteers to make this run. CBH members have always been generous with the funding, but I ALWAYS need people to help make this SAFE and to make it run without wearing out my volunteers. Many are getting older (like me), getting down to help a young boy or girl isn't hard. It's the getting back up that is hard!

Maya is providing the equipment, and Wilderness Archery is (as always) is providing lots of targets & incidentals for the show. Wilderness always donates a \$100.00 gift certificate, and with the money I have left over, I buy one or more to give away in the raffles (We had six last year!). I would encourage you to go to your Pro Shops up and down the state and ask if they would please help with this, maybe we can get some business to come their way, even if it is mail order. Our big expenses for the show are dollar bills and the balloons to put them in. I MUST purchase the thicker balloons (so the kids can't see the dollar bills inside) otherwise EVERYBODY targets THAT balloon! We go through about \$100.00 in ones over the three days we are there, and about 1000 balloons (at \$9.00 per hundred). We put one dollar in every tenth balloon. Trico Welding (Joe, Amanda, & Matt Knierem) provides a tank of gas to fill said balloons, saving many pairs of lips! Sacramento Balloons (Steve & Cathy Rostratter) takes real good care of us.

All of this is worthless without YOU, the volunteers. Without you, we might as well stay home. I need at least 10 people per shift, MORE on Saturday (we get the most traffic that day). As always, ISE provides tickets for the volunteers to get in, but DOES NOT cover parking (\$10.00 per car), so I advise carpooling. A lot of the clubs that come as a group either pay for or contribute to this expense. I want EVERYONE to wear their club shirts, hats, jackets, bring the club's banner, applications and any information about your club. I want the parents & grandparents to KNOW who it is that is helping their kids shoot. With movies like "The Hunger Games" and "Brave" there is a lot of new interest in archery, let's make sure we get these folks out to the clubs, and experience what WE enjoy. Maya Archers, Yolo Bowmen, Laguna Creek Archers, Wilderness JOAD, Lodi Bowmen, Yahi Bowmen, Cougar Mountain Archers, and Paradise Archers have all contributed both personnel and funds over the years. My own NorCal region of CBH ALWAYS contributes to help, last year DFG gave me some people when I was short. The kids LOVE to watch the guys IN UNIFORM with badges & guns have a shoot off with bows! The NASP (National Archery in the Schools Program) that DFG sponsors provides little things to hand out to the kids, as does Wilderness JOADS.

I have people that drive all the way from Chico & Paradise JUST to help. I had a couple from Red Bluff help us last year. Going to clubs, explaining what we do, I've had people walk up and give me money. Don Kouns, who owns a backhoe service and belongs to the Nevada County Sportsmen, sent a check for \$100.00 last year. Lodi traditionally helps finish the show on Sunday night, and help break everything down. One year due to a parking SNAFU, we had to take ALL the gear out to an outer parking lot, where the truck hauling it had to be kept. Nobody complained (except me, I'm usually pretty crabby after 3 days of Search & Rescue whistles), THIS is the QUALITY of the people who are shaping our archers of tomorrow.

I will fill slots on a first come, first serve basis, all tickets will be at Will Call (at Main Gates), under either club name or individuals. I'd ask that you show up 30 minutes before your shift, it makes things go a lot smoother. Maya took Friday night (As I write this in October), the hours & needs are as follows:

The show closes at 5:00PM, and it takes about an hour to get everything out (If everything goes right), so the last crew should plan on staying. Things will be easier this year with not being on with the CBH meeting. My good buddy & hunting partner John Waddles will be able to be there for the first time in years!! I've done this a long time, know I'm getting older (Advil is becoming my best friend), and I enjoy looking at all the kids coming through, wondering which one will be doing my job in future shows. Since we have anywhere from 1500-2400 kids over that three day period, bring your own pain relievers... My computer seems to be working this year, and I've always got my cell with me now (I know, I know...), so if you have any questions, or anything I can do to help, call or Email me.
