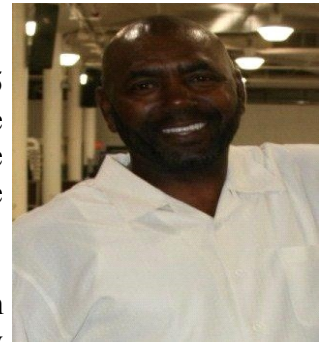

International Bowhunter Education Program (IBEP) classes have been scheduled locally for May 17<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> or June 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>. Classes are two days consisting of Friday evening from 6pm to 10pm at Wilderness Archery and Saturday 8am to 5pm at Maya Archery Range. Several states and countries require hunters to take this class in order to purchase bowhunter licenses, tags or to hunt during the bowhunting seasons.

Maya's Summer League will be run this year. It's been quite a while since this league was set up but requests from several members interested in it have prompted its inclusion for this year's summer events. This League is separate from the 3D or Broadhead leagues to be held on Saturday's this year. The "Summer League" will be on Thursday evenings shooting NFAA Archery Field Rounds on the clubs Field Course. League will last 12 weeks alternating between Field, Hunter and Animal (paper) rounds each week following NFAA rules. Starts May 2<sup>nd</sup> and concludes Aug. 1<sup>st</sup>, Awards and BBQ Aug. 8<sup>th</sup>. No league during the holiday weeks of Memorial and 4<sup>th</sup> of July. A minimum of 8 rounds is needed to qualify for awards. See flyer for fees, times and additional information.

One goal in starting this league back up has been requests on how to shoot the NFAA field rounds. Don't be shy or intimidated, we all have been there. People will be available to take groups onto the course to explain and shoot the course. Handouts will be available that will explain the process & procedures of the shooting stake positions, multiple targets and scoring the targets. It's not that hard if shown how.

## Nor Cal

What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 7 archery/bowhunting clubs and 2 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). What does Nor Cal and CBHSAA do for Archery or Bowhunting? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is "Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages". This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters. Future meeting dates, April 10th and May 8th, 7pm at the Maya Clubhouse.

The CBHSAA field championship will be held in June at multiple locations in the state. The State Broadhead Championship will again be held at the Tejon Ranch down by the grapevine corridor below Bakersfield May 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>. You can visit CBHSAA web site for more information on these and other tournaments or events.

Nor Cal region archery clubs also have several tournaments coming up. Nevada County Sportsmen is June 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> (Nevada City), Cougar Mountain Archers June 16<sup>th</sup> (Brownsville) and Feather River Archery club June 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> (Loyalton).

The 2013 California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) mammal regulation changes are before the California Fish and Game Commission (CFGC) now. A modification to Title 14 section 354 to allow lighted nocks while hunting was presented by the enforcement branch of CDFW to clarify language to benefit hunters. The CFGC will have their final vote at their April meeting in Santa Rosa. Several requests have been made to the CFGC and CDFW lately to change its Predator Management by using updated science and technology. Future meetings will highlight what specific changes can be made.

The California Legislature has recorded more than 2200 new bills by February 22<sup>nd</sup> for this Legislation session. According to the California Outdoor Heritage Alliance of the 2200, 50 directly affect hunting and fishing. Keep in mind a legislator can "Gut and Amend" any bill at any time bypassing normal procedures which could also be spot bills.

## Be Safe While Turkey Hunting

**CALIFORNIA** - The spring archery wild turkey season is just around the corner (May 6<sup>th</sup> – 19<sup>th</sup>) in California and with each passing year it appears to be gaining in popularity.

That popularity means there are more hunters. The spring hunt is different than most other hunts, in that hunters are wearing full camouflage. This means that hunters need to be extra careful of their target and background.

The National Wild Turkey Federation has a list of reminders for turkey hunters:

- Never shoot at sound or movement.
- Never shoot at a piece of a turkey. Make sure you can see the whole bird to determine if it is legal to shoot (1 bearded, 3 in possession in combined seasons).
- Eliminate the colors red, white and blue from your turkey-hunting clothing. Red is the color hunters use to differentiate a gobbler's head from a hen's blue-colored head.
- Be particularly careful when using a gobbler call. The sound may attract other hunters or mountain lions. If someone approaches, alert the hunter to your presence.
- Select a calling position that enables you to see 50 yards around you. If possible, your calling position should have a background at least as wide as your shoulders.

Other reminders include, respecting property rights, asking permission before crossing private land, and being aware of what is beyond your target before you shoot. Although turkey hunters often dress in full camouflage, they may consider wearing a blaze orange garment when walking to or from their calling spot. Some hunters also attach some orange flagging to the bird when carrying it back to their vehicle.

**Notes from the editor: CARDBOARD NEEDED**

For those that have had the opportunity to shoot at the targets at either the sight in range or below on the course, you will notice that the paper targets are glued to a cardboard backing. These targets range in size from 12X12 up to 24X 24 inches square. To help with the supply of cardboard we ask that our members bring in any extra cardboard that they can get. Large flat pieces are most needed. Smaller pieces are needed as well. Anything helps. Rather than tossing out your cardboard, stop by the club and donate it to be used at the range.

For any questions stop by the clubhouse and look at what we need. Time is taken at the work parties to cut the cardboard to size using a table saw that is set to the correct cut distance. Other days, as a crew we glue the paper targets to the cardboard backing. Wear older clothes for this as I usually end up with glue on my hands and pant legs.

Researching fletching configurations, I have found that there are three types of ways to reapply my fletches. The three configurations are the straight arrangement, the offset configuration, or the helical setup. From what I have been reading, the straight arrangement will not spin the arrow, the offset will give a slight spin; whereas, the helical setup will provide a greater rotational speed. The rotation will help stabilize the arrow over a longer flight path than a straight fletch configuration.

There is some loss of arrow speed with the helical, and not all arrow rests can tolerate this setup. The right or left rotation does not matter for stability, but the left rotation impact will tend to loosen the arrow tips and the right hand rotation will tighten the tip.

I have been re-fletching my arrows now using the Bitzenburger Dial-o-Fletch, it seems to be a very solid tool that will last forever. I can dial on a slight offset or keep them straight. To get a true helical pattern I will need to either buy a different clamp or file my straight clamp down. (file my clamp? I don't think so!)

Most of the arrows I see in our sponsor's store, Wilderness Archery in Rocklin, appear to have a strong helical or offset pattern to them. I will need to try this configuration out some time.

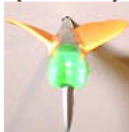

**Left Helical**  
(LH Rotation)



- Best broadhead stabilization.
- Most consistent arrow flight.
- Increased overall accuracy
- Arrow corrects attitude
- Notable loss of arrow velocity

**Left Offset**  
(LH Rotation)



- Better broadhead stabilization.


