### **Nor Cal**

What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 7 archery/bowhunting clubs and 2 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). What does Nor Cal and CBHSAA do for Archery or Bowhunting? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is "Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages". This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.

The California Fish and Game Commission (CFGF) agenda in November included a PUBLISH NOTICE OF COMMISSION INTENT TO AMEND DEPARTMENT LANDS REGULATIONS (SECTIONS 550, 550.5, 551, 552, 553, 630 AND 703, TITLE 14, CCR). Basically this is cleanup language to simplify land use regulation for department lands. CBHSAA has been working over the years to modify language in these regulations to clarify and allow bowfishing on these lands where fishing is permitted. Wording has been added in the amended language to allow this to happen. Public input will be taken at the December CFGF meeting with adoption at the February meeting.

Contributions to the Sport of Archery

2014 California Archery Hall of Fame – Robert Lawson aka Awesome Lawson

He is a great guy to be around a promoter of all aspects of Archery. He believes in order to be a good hunter you must first be a good archer/ target shooter. He is a promoter of Archery through the local clubs, region, state, national level by participating. His favorite pass time is Archery; he is a natural story teller of past experiences.

Robert was born in Moline, Illinois and raised in the country. He always liked being in the outdoors. He enjoyed his guns and likes the challenge of accuracy. In the Marine Corp he enjoyed shooting at the range and was a marksman. Out of the Marines in 1964 he decided to stay in California to live.

During the 1960s he joined Redwood Bowmen in the Oakland Hills, after testing the archery range he decided to join the club too. During this time he met Tim Meigs and purchased his first Meigs takedown bow and began to enjoy the sport of archery, after work and on weekends. Redwood Bowmen at that time was a bare bow club. This is a challenge for anyone belonging to the club with no sight or release. He enjoyed, learned, practiced archery daily and became a good archer.



In 1973 he moved to Idaho to enjoy the out of doors. Grangeville seemed to be a small town and a nice place to raise a family. Everyone was shooting with a sight and release and his bare bow days had to end with no competition at that time. So he moved into a Jennings compound, with pen sights and a release.

He was instrumental in starting the local club in Grangeville, Idaho he found land to lease, assistance in starting and setting up the club known as the Camas Prairie Bowmen, in Grangeville, Idaho. He was the president of the club from 1973 to 1985.

In 1984 he became an NFAA Archery Instructor and taught classes at one of the local schools. Through his leadership they hosted Indoor and outdoor leagues, monthly club shoots, monthly meetings, and hosted the Idaho State Broadhead shoot and two State Outdoor Shoots at the Camas Prairie Bowmen Range. The campfire girls had archery lessons through the club during those years. The club is still in existence today.

In 1986 Robert moved to Rio Linda, California. Looking for a range and club he found the Bowhunters Open shoot where he met archers from all over including Tom Burns from the Maya Bowhunters which is located in Roseville it wasn't too far from Rio Linda. Now he found other shoots to attend and was really shooting top score in BHFS class. If there was a shoot he and wife, Olivia were at it enjoying the event and making new friends. Because of his great scores in BHFS, one of his new friends and fellow competitor, Ernie Moore nicknamed Robert, Awesome Lawson. It was official for that time forward his nickname was Awesome.

Recognizing that he had been in National Field Archery Association member since the 1960s he decided in 1987 it was time to join as a Life Member.

This same year he was up to a new challenge and started shooting a Longbow with wood arrows and returning back to the basics. He continues to shoot the same style today.

Around 1990 he was up to the challenge to become a Bowyer and Custom Wood Arrow maker who takes pride in his creations. He is always willing to share his knowledge and skills with others. He began building his own cedar arrows and it became an art for him. He also began making longbows just after this wanting to design and shoot one of his own.

Through his generosity raffles in the past he has donated custom longbows at the Awesome Stickbow Shoot, Traditional Archers of California Shoot, Gene Foster Shoot, and a few to the Longbow Safari Event. He has generously donated many dozens of custom arrows to raffles around the state and continues to do this at the TAC, Awesome Stickbow, Gene Foster, and the annual Longbow Safari Events and occasional a dozen to the CBH State Meeting raffle. Most people who win his arrows want to hang them on the wall and they say they are too pretty to shoot!

In 1990 he went to the San Francisco Traditional Shoot and came home with a new title it was President of Traditional Archers of California. His wife became the secretary and treasurer at the same time. He held this office for 14 years hosting many different traditional shoots including the Western States in 1996, at Bear Creek, 2000 and 2004 at Elk Creek. In 1997 he was instrumental in organizing and starting the Santa Ynez Traditional Shoot in Los Olives, California. He organized and ran that shoot for several years until he found a group of traditional shooters in Southern California to take it over. He was instrumental in setting up the rules and guidelines for Traditional Archers today.

In February of 1994 his exceptional contributions to Maya Archers including being Vice President, Nor Cal Representative, dedication in making this club a great club Robert and Olivia were honored with a Life Membership to the club.

March of 1995 he and his wife, Olivia joined Nor Cal as Life Members. Nor Cal members since 1987 he has been instrumental in advising the Nor Cal Region and state on the Traditional Style, including definitions of the style in California. He has been a Nor Cal Representative for Maya Archers in the past and attended meetings for many years.

Past ten years has assisted in the Maya Archers monthly Roseville Parks and Recreation 2 hr. class for young interested archers from the age of 7 to seniors. In the past has participated in instructing the Boy Scouts, campfire girls during their camp.

Over twenty six years ago created and organized the Maya Bowhunters Stick bow Classic. In 2002 this shoot was renamed after him and his known as the Awesome Stickbow Classic. This is a longbow, recurve and primitive only shooting event with 30 targets. For many years he scheduled and picked up canoes to shoot out of at this shoot. Created the flying goose shot with archers using flu flu arrows across the creek.

He has been instrumental in creating and helping with the local Maya Toys for Tots Shoot over the past 26 years. He has held various offices in Maya and currently on the board of director's to help guide the club since 1986. In the past he has made special awards for the Awesome Stick bow Classic shoot and dedicating many hours of time. Over the past twenty eight years he has been helping out on the range and in the past four years he has been chief cook at the club work parties each month.

In 2006 Robert volunteered to drive a fellow disabled friend and archer, Glenn Bats ford around on the back of a quad runner for 12 weeks to shoot the Maya Archers Broadhead League. He constructed a seat, help lift him in the seat, belted him on the back and assisted him as needed for Glen to enjoy the league. In 2007 Robert found a trailer and worked on it for hauling Glenn to make things easier for both of them. He made a ramp, with assistance they rolled the wheel chair up on the trailer, belted it down and Glenn was ready to shoot again for 12 weeks league. He would help him shoot, retrieve his arrows and keep his score each week. He assisted Glenn until 2012 at that time he was unable to continue due to the steep terrain of the course and due to his health issues.

Overall all he has dedicated a piece of his life to Archery and at the same time enjoyed sharing his knowledge and skills of the sport. He has made many friends during his experiences in Archery.

Since he was a young boy he has always enjoyed hunting and continues to do so. He has hunted squirrels, carp, tilapia, deer, elk, bear, turkey, antelope, and javelina. Most of all he enjoys the camp fire and sharing of stories from the past.

He is one of the top Traditional Shooters in California today. He supports local, state and national tournaments year round. He has been known to take his van full of archers to many shoots. Recently in a Turkey Shoot he became known to throw a shoot off when his competition was a 12 year old boy. He would give you the shirt off his back if you needed it and ask for nothing in return.

He has participated in archery tournaments from California, Nevada, Idaho Oregon, Washington, Montana, Arizona, Colorado, South Dakota, Mississippi and to various places in Canada. He enjoys visiting with old and new friends and every minute of the travel. He lives up to his name he is a generous and Awesome Guy!

Here I am again, turning up like a bad penny... The ISE Show is coming up in January, and as always, I need your help. Donations from the clubs, and as many volunteers as I can get. We started putting padding underneath the carpeting (to help with the getting up and down) last year, maybe some inventor has an idea for something mechanical to help us old farts!! We are going to have drawings for equipment this year, so please ask your local archery shops to donate anything they can, equipment, gift certificates, ANYTHING archery for us to give to the kids. Remember, they are tomorrow's archers... We must do all that we can to ignite the love WE have for archery, so that it is the lifelong passion we have for it. You CAN and DO make a difference!!

Maya is providing the equipment and Wilderness Archery (as always) is providing lots of targets & incidentals for the show. Wilderness always donates a \$100.00 gift certificate, and with the money I have left over, I buy one or more to give away in the raffles. Again, I would encourage you to go to your Pro Shops up and down the state and ask if they would please help with this, maybe we can get some business to come their way, even if it is mail order. The kids will start it, maybe we can get the parents & grandparents interested as well to make it a family affair. I ALWAYS try to talk to the parents & grandparents about not only the kids shooting, but also about shooting together as a FAMILY. Our big expenses for the show are dollar bills and the balloons to put them in. I MUST purchase the thicker balloons (so the kids can't see the dollar bills inside) otherwise EVERYBODY targets THAT balloon! We go through about \$100.00 in ones over the three days we are there, and about 1000 balloons (at \$9.00 per hundred). We put one dollar in every tenth balloon. Trico Welding (Joe, Amanda, & Matt Knierem) provides a tank of gas to fill said balloons, saving many pairs of lips! Sacramento Balloons (Steve & Cathy Rostratter) takes real good care of us. Whenever he sees the advertisements for the ISE Show, Steve orders the balloons he KNOWS I will be coming in for.

All of this is worthless without YOU, the volunteers. Without you, we might as well stay home. I need at least 10 people per shift, MORE on Saturday (we get the most traffic that day). As always, ISE provides tickets for the volunteers to get in, but DOES NOT cover parking (\$10.00 per car), so I advise carpooling. A lot of the clubs that come as a group either pay for or contribute to this expense. I want EVERYONE to wear their club shirts, hats, jackets, bring the club's banner, applications and any information about your club. I want the parents & grandparents to KNOW who it is that is helping their kids shoot. Last year, my own club, Maya traditionally takes Friday night (after helping set up during that day, this is also when Joe Becker & Dick Vermillion are here), El Dorado Hills, Nevada County Sportsmen, Yahi Bowmen, Yolo Bowmen, and Lodi Bowmen (Lodi works Sunday night and helps break everything down, so we can get out of there, and keeps me from crying). I'm hoping my Wilderness JOADS don't have a shoot this time, as they are VERY inspirational for the kids. Diablo Bowmen had a shoot last year that conflicted with the ISE show dates, so I'm hoping I can get them in for 2014. I am more than happy to have singles, couples, or groups to come out and represent your club. We will make it work, and I am very grateful for any and ALL help. So how about it, are you up to putting smiles on a bunch of kids faces??

I will fill slots on a first come, first serve basis, all tickets will be at Will Call (at Main Gates), under either club name or individuals. I'd ask that you show up 30 minutes before your shift, it makes things go a lot smoother. Maya took Friday night (As I write this in October), Lodi takes the end of show, the hours & needs are as follows:
