What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 7 archery/bowhunting clubs and 2 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). What does Nor Cal and CBHSAA do for Archery or Bowhunting? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is "Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages". This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state

area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.

The California Fish and Game Commission (CFGF) agenda in December included a notice of publish intent for mammal regulations changes. This a normal publish that happens every year at this time to set tag counts for the upcoming hunting season. Current tag numbers are in a range and by the end of March final numbers will be established before the commission has final adoption at their April meeting.

CBHSAA annual meeting this year was held January 17th – 19th in the Sacramento area. Friday afternoon the Legislative Committee had its annual meeting to recap last year's issues and establish priorities for the next year. A new incentive program to individuals and clubs that donate to the Legislative Defense Fund will have the option to obtain CBHSAA Logo wear such as printed or embroidered hats, shirts, jackets etc.

The next Maidu All Skills Archery Class will be Saturday February 15th and March 15th 10am to 12pm. These classes are held at the site in range far right side. During these classes the site in range is still open except for the 20 yard target for safety reasons. Thanks to all the members who have used the site in range while the classes have been held to keep safety as a priority.

Maya participated in the Cal Expo Sportsmen Shows Youth Fair. The International Bowhunter Education Program set up an archery range in the youth fair to compliment many other fun activities such as trout fishing, BB gun shooting, Laser Shot to name a few. Maya Archers, Lodi Bowmen, Yahi Bowmen, Wilderness Joad members manned certain time slots introducing the sport of Archery to a couple of thousand youths over 3 days.

Hello Maya Archers, 2014 has started off with incredibly nice weather for archery. With this nice weather, we need to keep bow maintenance in mind.

I would like to go over string waxing. When I first bought my bow, a wax was not even mentioned. When somebody else looked at the bow at the club they asked "how often was I waxing my bow string?" with a dumb look, I assume, on my face I wondered, what in the h*** was he talking about? Well, it turned out that waxing the bow string will add a great deal of life to the string. It was also mentioned not to wax any of the serving parts. The serving parts are the sections of the string that are wrapped with another string and tied to provide extra protection to the string itself. It was not explained to me why we would not wax that section, only don't do it!. I was talking with the fine people at Wilderness Archery and they mentioned that if we wax the serving portion of the string the wax will work it's way under the outer string and pull it apart. Ah,,, now that I can understand. I have not found a hard set rule on how often to wax, but it seem to be a consensus on every other time or two out on the range. I have also waxed each time I go out and work the wax into the string with my fingers to warn it up and "melt it into the string. This seems to work for me.

I found this article helpful from BCY Bowstring, whose website is <http://www.bcyfibers.com/>

Question: Is it necessary to use "special" wax with certain types of bowstring material?

Answer: Not really.

There are four main reasons for using wax on a bowstring.

1. To lubricate the fibers and prevent "fiber to fiber" abrasion
2. To help keep the "bundle" of strands together
3. To maintain and extend the life of the string
4. To help prevent water absorption

Bowstring material manufacturers normally apply a generous amount of synthetic wax in liquid form, which insures that from its origin the bowstring material is well lubricated inside and out. It is this process which gives the material its basic protection from fiber to fiber abrasion and helps keep the bundle of strands together. Generally the type of wax used would be a good quality standard "tacky" wax. At this stage it would be unusual for the wax to include silicone which is very slick and, particularly in the case of Flemish strings, makes it difficult to convert the bowstring material into a finished bowstring. However, after the string is made, it is recommended that the archer look for a "maintenance" wax that contains some silicone because a wax blended with silicone penetrates the string material very well and keeps the inside fibers lubricated as well as the outside. Wax can be applied with fingers, with a cloth, or with a chamois leather. It should be applied frequently and rubbed well into the string.

Please respond, as this could be a good discussion on bow maintenance.

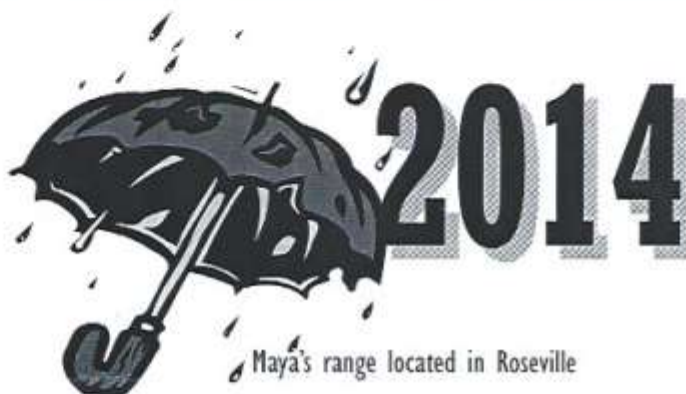

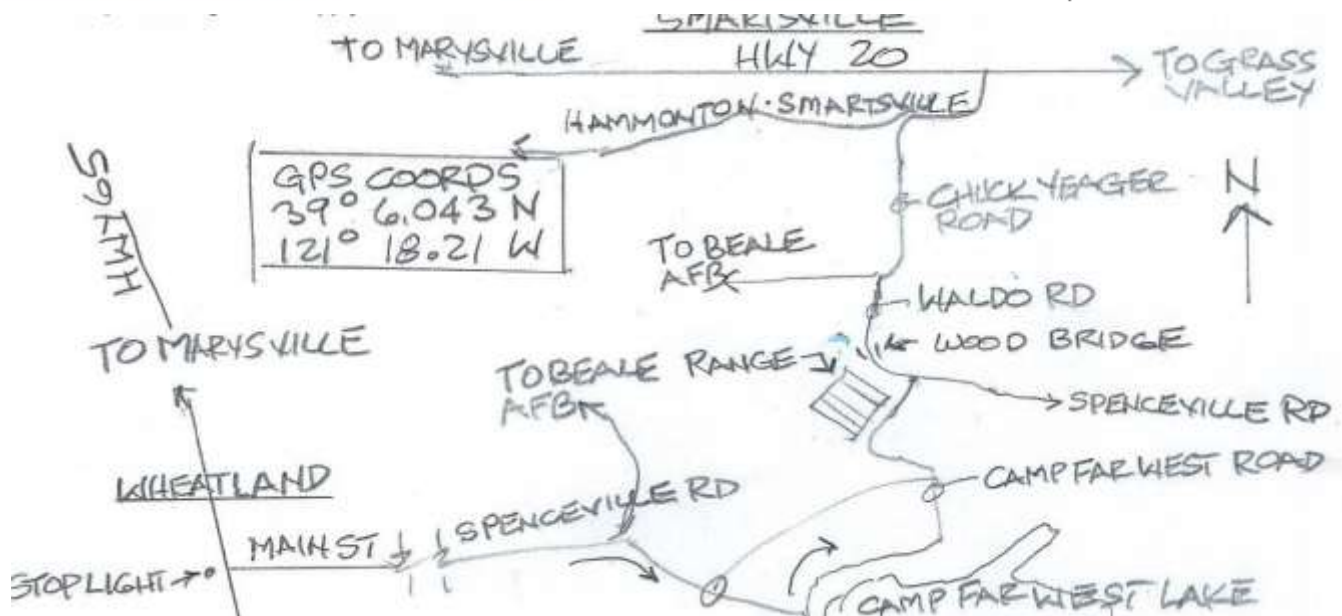
