NOTE: NEW EMAIL DISTRIBUTION!!!!!!

This month I have started using a new e-mail distribution method. using Surewest, I am limited to 50 e-mail addresses per message. With close to 400 names on my list, this required sending out 8 email messages of the same thing, plus if I sent them all at once they would block them as spam. Calling support was not fruitful, as they were not allowed to tell me why my emails were getting rejected, this has become a hassle to the point I have found a different method.

I will be using a mail distribution system called Mailchimp. The emails now will be through that distribution channel. The look may be a bit different and **the actual newsletter will not be included in the email**. What will be included is a link on where to download the file. With this method I will be able to have a couple different sizes of the newsletter that you can choose to download and save to your PC. This new mail service will also allow others to send emails to the entire Maya Archers members directly without the need for me to distribute them. The new email list is now directly tied to the active members list and emails on record in the club database.

This email distribution systems also allows me to track who opened the email, plus gives people the opportunity to unsubscribe to the emails in the future. If you are not receiving the emails, check your spam filter first, then contact me and I can see what the club has on record for your email address. The first email that I sent out this last Saturday, has an open rate of about 50%. This to me seems low for an active club, or maybe we are sending too many emails.



Please let me know how this is working out. We are not locked into anything at this time.

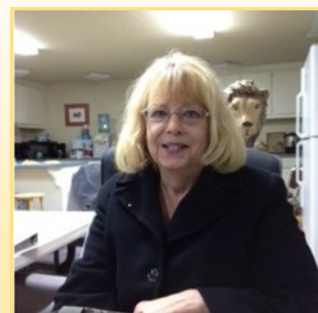
Membership

Nor Cal

What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 7 archery/bowhunting clubs and 2 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). What does Nor Cal and CBHSAA do for Archery or Bowhunting? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is "Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages". This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state

area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.

The California Fish and Game Commission (CFGF) agenda for February included public comment for mammal regulations changes. Several environmental groups spoke towards eliminating any contest or incentives that involves wildlife but mainly coyotes. The Wildlife Resources Committee (WRC) will have this on its agenda for its May meeting. The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) delivered a response not to list the gray wolf as endangered but will list as a species of concern at this time. CDFW has already started to draft a wolf management plan so when they start showing up in the state a plan will be ready. Environmental groups want the wolf restored to their original historic areas with no controls and without consideration to mankind and to some extent other species. While this has merit several hundred years ago when the human population was several million, additional management is necessary with the human population now above 300 million in the US.

During these classes the site in range is still open except for the 20 yard target for safety reasons. When I see people shooting at the club, there are those that use compound style of bow and those that have use the classic style of a bow that I we see in movies and remember as a kid growing up. This traditional style of bow is broken down into two categories, the longbow and the recurve. At first I did not pay much attention to the different as from a distance it is hard to see unless you are aware of what to look for. I found and article on differencebetween.com that helps summarize up the difference between these two styles of bows.

Longbow and Recurve are the names or rather terms used to refer to two different types of bows that are being used today in archery competitions, as well as hunting game. While the bow and arrow have been used by mankind since time immemorial, there have been changes in the bow and the arrows that are used with the bows. Despite many similarities, there are differences between the longbow and the recurve that will be highlighted.

Longbow

Longbow is a type of bow that is more or less similar to the English letter D. If you take a long and thin straw and try to make a bow out of it by turning it into a semicircle of sorts and tying a string at the two ends, what you get is a longbow. The longbow is the earliest bow made by mankind in its endeavor to make a weapon out of arrows that could be hurled at great velocity by drawing the string of these bows. Longbows are still being used though they are not allowed to be used by the contestants at the Olympics archery competitions.

Recurve

Recurve is a type of bow that is a later invention in the history of mankind though excavations have revealed that these bows were being used by human beings even 2000 years ago. A recurve bow has limbs that are curved inwards at the end making it look very different from the longbow.

Longbow vs Recurve Bow

- Longbow is older in the history of mankind than Recurve.
- Longbow looks like the English letter D, whereas Recurve has the ends of the bow curved inwards.
- Recurve being shorter in length makes it more convenient to hold when used in close quarters.
- Curved ends of the bow provide more power to the arrow in the case of a Recurve. According to experts, same power used by the individual can impart 10% more velocity to the arrow in the case of a Recurve.
- Longbow is not permitted to be used by archers at the Olympics; they can only use Recurve bows.

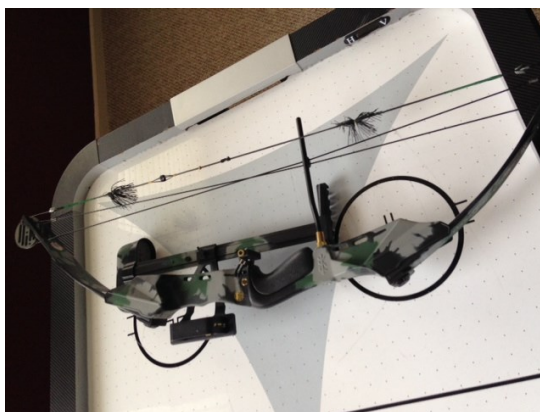

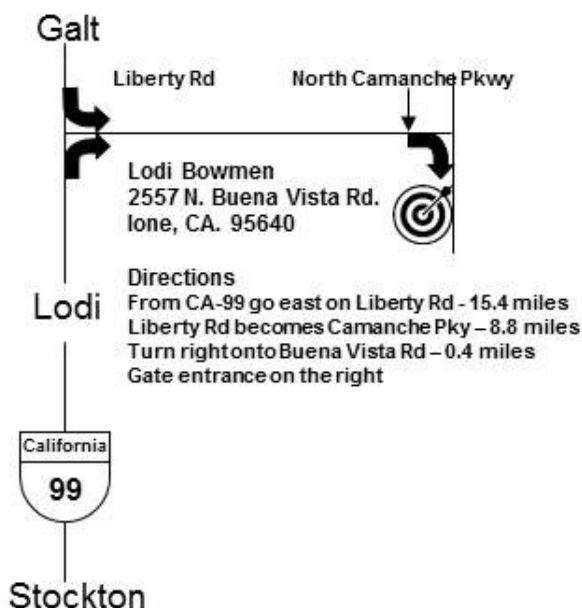
