What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 7 archery/bowhunting clubs and 2 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). What do Nor Cal and CBHSAA do for Archery or Bowhunting? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is "Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages". This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.

A few archery clubs in the south part of the state have been facing opposition from individuals and groups to having archery ranges on public land or the use of certain targets. For safety reasons, archery ranges will restrict how persons move around and the targets they opposed are used in competition. These individuals or groups either don't like archery or feel the safety restrictions violates their rights to use public land. CBHSAA has been working with these archery clubs providing safety, technical, history and advantages of archery. For some of these clubs their lease agreements are being renewed or will be soon.

The California Fish and Game Commission (CFG) met October 8th in Shasta. Agenda items included: Possible ratification of Commission findings to list Gray Wolf as threatened or endangered, Commission voted to accept findings. Possible changes to regulations regarding predators, non-game and furbearers. The Wildlife Resources Committee (WRC) has been working through many proposals and will continue discussing possibilities. Possible changes to hunting contests and/or inducements. Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) have started research into coyote population dynamics and will spend roughly a year assembling documents for a management plan. 2015/16 mammal regulation proposals were submitted to FGC from DFW. Tag allotments for big game species and mandatory deer tag reporting are the major changes. The mandatory deer tag reporting of successful or unsuccessful tag holders will get more accurate information to DFW for species management. Failure to report would resort in a fine payable when purchasing the next years hunting license.

The CBHSAA annual meeting and Big Game Banquet will be January 23rd through the 25th. Chuck Adams will be the seminar speaker Saturday afternoon and is free for CBHSAA members or \$35 for non-members. Discussions during new business at the meeting will include DFW's work on requiring bowhunter education to bowhunt California.

Alaska is now requiring the Bowhunter Education Certificate to bowhunt the state affective July 1, 2016. Their website states they will not accept another states hunting license or tag as proof of taking the class. 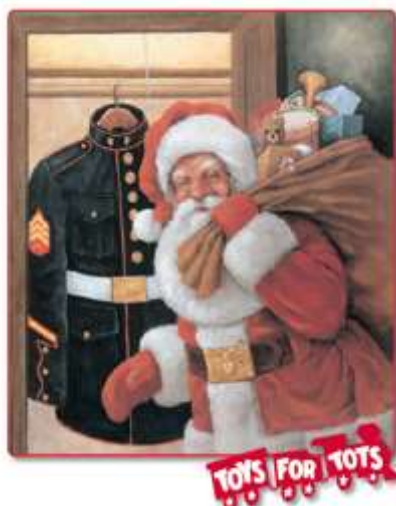
