What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 9 archery/bowhunting clubs and 3 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). What do Nor Cal and CBHSAA do for Archery or Bowhunting? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is "Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages". This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state

area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.

The next California Fish and Game Commission meeting (CFGF) will be June 10 & 11 in Mammoth Lake. Agenda has not been posted but from the April meeting upland birds and waterfowl regulations will be discussed. Ticks at the range

We are all extremely fortunate to have an exceptional setting to practice the art of archery so close to where we live or work. The well maintained range is peaceful and relaxing yet skillfully challenging in layout and design.

With the close proximity of bike trails, traffic and shopping, it is easy to slip into a mindset of walking in a green city scape when in reality, the Maya Bow Range is a wilderness interface.

The turkeys, rabbits, cranes and other wildlife present, is a subtle reminder that this isn't a public park. The reality is that this is Mother Nature's backyard and does contain some inherent potential risks that all of the members need to be aware of.

Our recent years of drought and lack of inclement weather has resulted in a banner crop of insects, including ticks belonging to the Genera Dermacentor. These ticks are extremely well suited for this area and are a risk for bites and possible infection. I have found 4 ticks in my last 3 outings at the range; on myself, the dog and my wife.

Ticks can patiently wait in the tall grasses and even scale into the trees, waiting 3 months or longer to climb onto or drop down onto a passing warm blooded animal. They are attracted by exhaled carbon dioxide and do not discriminate between turkeys, deer, rabbits or Maya Bow members. Ticks can live up to an astounding 3 years and one laboratory specimen was kept alive 5 years in a vial on a shelf!

Tick bites can transmit diseases caused by numerous pathogens that include viruses, bacteria, spirochetes or rickettsia. The manifestations range from staph infections, Lyme disease, Tularemia (rabbit fever), Brucellosis, and tick paralysis. Obviously, none of these are desirable mementos of an afternoon shoot, and can adversely affect you for years.

Prevention is the most effective means to avoid the incidence of annoying bites to severe illness. Hats or scarves to shield the hair is effective, tucking in shirts and wearing socks protects the lower body and applying a repellent containing DEET dissuades the parachuting assailants from the trees.

Should you suffer a tick bite, a visit to your primary care physician would be in your best interests. Prophylactic tetracycline may be a recommended course of action as the clinical progression of any of these contracted diseases can be debilitating or even life threatening.

Odd rashes, fevers and being the only one to suffer a summer flu should alert you to the possibility of an undiscovered bite.

Take appropriate actions out in the "wilds", and practice safety.

Archery Instructor Certification Class

The following 2 classes have been scheduled for individuals to obtain instructor certifications.

Basic Archery Instructor Certification class: Saturday June 6th, 8am to 6pm

A Basic Archery Instructor (BAI or Level 1) certification class from USA Archery is recognized by all organizations for the teaching of basic archery classes. Parks & Recreation districts, Youth Camps, Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts to name a few. No Archery experience necessary, but must be at least 18 years of age. Minors ages 16 and 17 can take the class with parents' permission but must instruct under the direction of a certified adult. Class fee: \$60 per person; includes student package and a 3 year certification.

Level 2 Archery Instructor Certification Class: Saturday, June 6th & Sunday, June 7, 8am to 6pm

A level 2 Archery Instructor certification class from USA Archery is for individuals needing this level of certification to run a Junior Olympic Archery Program (JOAD) or an organized archery program. No Archery experience necessary, but must be at least 18 years of age. Class fee: \$120 per person; includes student package and application for a 3 year certification. Additional requirements from USA Archery include passing a background check (\$20), passing a Safe Sport Training class (online) and membership in either USA Archery or the National Field Archery Association (fees vary).
