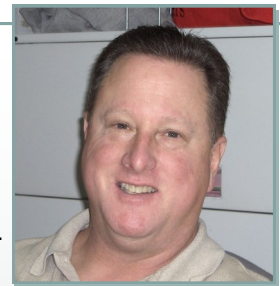

Nor Cal

What is Nor Cal? The full name for this regional group is Nor Cal Bowhunters. They represent the areas 9 archery/bowhunting clubs and 3 archery pro shops to California Bowmen Hunters State Archery Association (CBHSAA). CBHSAA and Nor Cal are chartered to the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). What do Nor Cal and CBHSAA do for Archery or Bowhunting? There are many facets to their representation of Archery and Bowhunting. CBHSAA is "Dedicated to Promoting and Protecting the Archery and Bowhunting Heritages". This statewide organization speaks for California Archers and Bowhunters in matters concerning Legislation and Regulation since 1943. The Legislative committee of CBHSAA includes a Coordinator, 6 state

area reps and each region group has one legislative representative. Archery is a shooting sport so at times issues arise to limit or exclude the shooting of Bows and Arrows for any purpose. CBHSAA will pursue those actions for the benefit of all Archers and Bowhunters.

Success, Pasadena Roving Archers has successfully fought back petitions to city council for closing its archery range after 80 years. An organized group attempted to eliminate the archery range on Arroyo Park with the assistance of the Mayors wife. Long story short, many letters, persons attending council meetings and Parks department recommendations convinced a majority of council members to not pass the petition.

The next California Fish and Game Commission meeting (CFGF) will be April 8 & 9 in Santa Rosa. Agenda items include; adoption on Mammal regulations including tag allotments for big game species and mandatory deer tag reporting, continue discussion on implementation of AB711 lead ammunition and SB1223 Bobcat Protection Act and petitions for upland bird and waterfowl proposals. The Wildlife Resources Committee (WRC) of the FGC continues there discussions on predator management changes.

2015/2016 hunting season starts July 1st. After the adoptions of the mammal regulations in April, license, tags and applications should be available towards the end of April. You have until June 2nd to apply for draw hunts, make sure your apps are submitted by the deadline. Information is now available on DFW website for tag proposals and allocations.

Community

The next Maidu All Skills Archery Class will be Wednesday May 20th, 6:30 to 8:30pm. These classes are held at the site in range far right side. During these classes the site in range is still open except for the wall of hay and sometimes the 20 yard target for extra-large groups. Thanks to all the members who have used the site in range while the classes have been held to keep safety as a priority.

Maya Leagues continue through the summer months. The Summer League starts Thursday April 30th at 5:30pm shooting the field course and NFAA targets. Broadhead League starts Saturday May 9th at 9am shooting 3D targets. The Field Point League starts May 9th at 9am utilizing the same targets as the Broadhead League but field/target points are used.

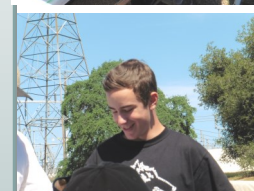
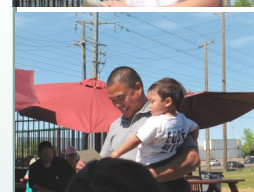

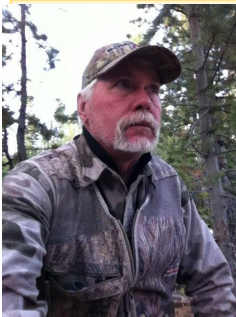

I strongly suggest that you get involved by joining and supporting groups like Pope & Young Club, Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, Safari Club International, or Mule Deer Foundation. Another good way to stay informed is signing up with an excellent watch dog group called 'Big Game Forever'. Once you have signed up for email notifications about threats to your hunting rights, you will be notified and given suggestions to make your voice heard.

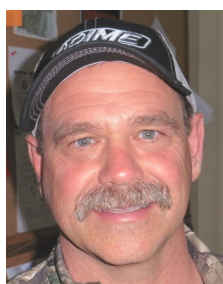

This month I was asked why the compound bows can shoot farther than the traditional bows with the same draw weight, and I knew it had to do with the cams and longer acceleration curve over the length of the release cycle, but could not explain it in much more detail. Well, this got me looking for more information. Here is the best website I found that helps with this explanation.

We will begin our discussion of the bow draw curve by defining a few terms and then will look at the draw curves for a compound and conventional bow.

Draw Force - The "draw weight" on the string as you pull back the bow. The draw force changes as the bow string is drawn and the shape of the draw force curve is dependent on the type of bow.

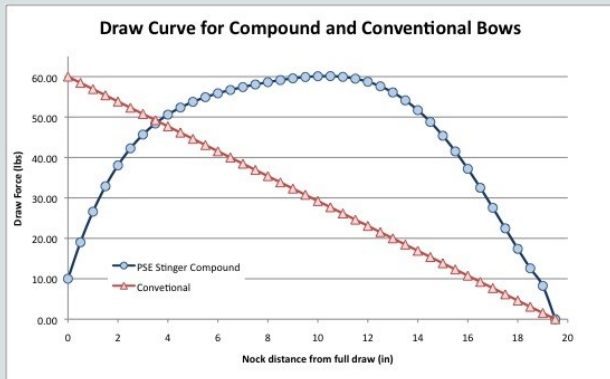
Draw Distance - The distance that the bow string is drawn from the rest position. The total draw length of the bow is the draw distance plus the brace height.

Potential Energy - The energy stored in the bow at any draw distance. Potential energy is a function of draw force and draw distance.

Kinetic Energy - The energy transferred from the bow to the arrow upon release. For a modern bow this will almost equal the potential energy, with some (10%) of the potential energy lost to moving the bow and making noise.

The figure below shows the draw curve for a PSE Stinger compound bow and a conventional, long or recurve bow, both with a total draw weight of 60 pounds. Notice that the X axis is nock travel distance from full draw so the zero position is at full draw and 19.5 inches is the point of arrow release. The draw force of a conventional bow increases linearly to full draw, in this case 60 pounds. In contrast, the compound bow rapidly reaches a draw force of 60 pounds in the first six inches of draw, remains above 50 pounds force for the next nine inches, and then lets off to about 10 pounds force at full draw.

The potential energy stored by each bow type is the area under each curve in units of ft-pounds or newton-meters. To calculate the area the draw curve was divided up into 40 half inch intervals of draw distance and multiplied by the average draw force of each interval (simple numerical integration). The sum of these 40 intervals is the total potential energy stored in the bow with units of force times distance (ft-pounds in the US and newton-meters for the rest of the world). An example spreadsheet is attached to the end of this post.



The results for the two bow types are listed below. Notice that the compound bow stores about 40% more potential energy than the conventional bow with the same draw weight. Of course, this means that it takes 40% more energy to pull a compound bow, but because of the let off is much easier to hold the bow at full draw.

In a perfect world, the potential energy stored in the bow is

completely transferred to kinetic energy of the arrow.

potential energy = kinetic energy = $\frac{1}{2}(\text{mass})(\text{velocity})^2$

In the real world, modern bows are 85-92% efficient. Assuming 100% efficiency

The 60 pound compound bow will launch the arrow at 275 ft/s while the conventional bow of the same draw weight will launch the arrow at 228 ft/s.

A more subtle aspect of the draw curve for both bow types is the effect of draw curve shape on arrow acceleration. The acceleration of the arrow may be calculated at any point during the arrow launch using the relationship between force and acceleration

Force = mass * acceleration

This means the acceleration curves look the same as the force draw curves after being scaled up or down for mass. A conventional bow has maximum acceleration at the point of arrow release. The arrow must have sufficient spine for this acceleration. In contrast, the compound bow accelerates the arrow more gradually and then reaches maximum acceleration for a longer distance. Since the maximum acceleration is the same the arrow spine may be the same, but the longer maximum acceleration results in greater arrow velocity.

Check out the technical archery website for more information about the physics behind our sport.

While it might not help me hold my bow steady, it at least lets me understand what is happening in the process of the bow and flight of the arrows.
