ARTICLE 1

OFFICERS DUTIES:

President

- 1. Elected on even numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Meet with the City of Roseville concerning the lease and other agreements set forth by the Board of Directors.
- 3. Presides at all meetings, and in general performs all duties incident to his office.
- 4. Organizes and runs the 'Annual Flashlight Shoot', 'Trail Shoot'. Oversees all club activities. Responsible for sending winning scores for these shoots to Newsletter Editor for publication.
- 5. Responsible for the Annual Awards Banquet as Host and MC for each year in office.
- 6. Appoints NOR-CAL Representatives as needed.
- 7. Writes an article for the Club Newsletter.
- 8. Must be a Maya Member for at least 2 years.
- 9. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 10. Must attend monthly Board and Club meetings.
- 11. Other duties as required.
- 12. Responsible to send scores to Web master for Maya's 'Around the World' and 'Awesome Stickbow Classic'.

Vice President

- 1. Elected on odd-numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Presides at Monthly Club and Board meetings in the absence of the President.
- 3. Assists the President in meeting with the City of Roseville concerning the lease and other agreements set forth by the Board of Directors.
- 4. Organizes, appoints committees to run the Maya's 'Around the World' Open and 'Awesome Stickbow Classic'.
- 5. Writes an article for the Club Newsletter.
- 6. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 7. Must be a Maya Member for at least 2 years.
- 8. Must attend monthly Board and Club meetings.
- 9. Other duties as required.

Vice President Target

- 1. Elected on even numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Responsible for appointing 1 assistant to VP Target under his direction.
- 3. Responsible for the inventory of Regulation Paper targets for Field, Hunter, Animal rounds and 3-D Animals.
- 4. With approval of membership order repairs and replacement on all 3-D animals prior to any Invitational or 3-D Club event. This should be done in a timely manner, to insure that 3-D animals are available and ready one month prior to the event.

- 5. Writes an article for the Club Newsletter.
- 6. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH, and Nor Cal Region.
- 7. Must be a Maya Member for at least 2 years.
- 8. Must attend monthly Club meeting.
- 9. Other duties as required.

Vice President Hunting

- 1. Elected on even numbered years for a period of two (2) years.
- 2. Responsible for organizing and running monthly Hunting Meeting.
- 3. Provide information on General Hunt dates & Regulations for Archery seasons.
- 4. Keep records of Small and Big game for Club Members submitted during the year for awards.
- 5. Present Hunting awards at the Annual Banquet.
- 6. Write an article for the Club Newsletter.
- 7. Must attend monthly Club meeting.
- 8. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 9. Other duties as required.

Treasurer

- 1. Elected on odd numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Maintains accurate records and makes monthly financial reports at the Club and Board meetings.
- 3. Shall be required to be bonded; all fees related to bonding to be paid by the club.
- 4. Pays all approved bills and deposits all receipts on a regular weekly or monthly basis.
- 5. Works Registration at Maya's Invitational shoots. Including 'Around the World' and 'Awesome Stickbow Classic'.
- 6. Provides starting cash and receives all receipts for any Club functions.
- 7. Chooses a Bank which is best suited to conduct His or Her duties as treasurer.
- 8. Handles all business with NFAA concerning charter, and insurance
- 9. Heads Committee to present Annual Budget at the December meeting.
- 10. Must be a Maya Member for at least 2 years.
- 11. Must attend monthly Board and Club meetings.
- 12. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 13. Other duties as required.

Class Secretary

- 1. Elected on odd numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Maintains official club records of Monthly Club Shoot scores and present Club Shoot awards at the annual banquet.
- 3. Classifies each shooter according to Style, Class, and Age by using NFAA guidelines.
- 4. Organizes registration and heads the committee for Invitational Shoots. Open and Awesome Stick bow Classic.
- 5. Register shooters at Monthly Club Shoot on 2nd Sunday of each month.
- 6. Provides information for joining National Field Archery Association and handles all business with NFAA concerning awards.
- 7. Orders and presents Club Championship and Spot Program Awards at the Annual Banquet.
- 8. Writes an article and furnishes scores of each monthly Club Shoot for the newsletter and internet.

- 9. Must attend monthly Club meeting.
- 10. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 11. Other duties as required.

Secretary

- 1. Elected on even numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Assists the President in meeting with the City of Roseville concerning the lease and other agreements set forth by the Board of Directors.
- 3. Records and reads the minutes of Monthly Club and Board Meetings.
- 4. Maintains a file of the minutes at the Club House for inspection by any member of Maya Bowhunters.
- 5. Secretary is the Chairperson for the membership committee.
- 6. Maintains the club database for an accurate list of current members for mailing and a Directory for the membership. Responsible to enter new monthly membership, information and printing of membership cards at each monthly meeting.
- 7. Prepares Annual membership billing, renewals, mail new membership cards and records membership status.
- 8. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 9. Must attend monthly Board and Club meetings.
- 10. Other Duties as required.

Newsletter Editor

- 1. Elected on odd numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Receives articles to organize, print, and mail newsletter.
- 3. Publish any article, ad, or flyer that has met the approval of the Board of Directors.
- 4. Publish newsletter every 2 months.
- 5. Each newsletter to include events and work schedules for the next 90 days.
- 6. Sends Shoot scores and newsletter to webmaster each month.
- 7. Must attend monthly Club meeting.
- 8. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 9. Other Duties as required.

NOR-CAL Representative

- 1. Appointed by the President for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Attends NOR-CAL Region meetings and reports to the Club at the monthly meeting on past, present, and future events or information regarding NOR-CAL business.
- 3. Writes and article for the Club Newsletter.
- 4. Must attend monthly Club meeting.
- 5. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 6. Other Duties as required.

Publicity Representative

- 1. Elected on even numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Helps promote good internal and external public relations with the promotion of all club events (i.e. leagues, annual shoots, special events) with the members and local community.
- 3. Responsible for all promotional media, which shall be approved by the Board of Directors prior to release of i.e. flyers, website, letters.

- 4. Works with outside organizations with interest in promotion of organized archery. (*i.e. Boy Scouts, Bowhunter Education, and Hunter Safety*)
- 5. Responsible for the organization of the Raffle for Invitational Shoots and heads the Raffle committee.
- 6. Organizes the Annual Swap Meet Family Fun Day Shoot each year in May.
- 7. Organizes 'Toys 4 Tots Shoot' and is the primary contact working with the Marines and their website for the collection of the toys.
- 8. Writes an article for the Club Newsletter.
- 9. Must attend monthly Club meeting.
- 10. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 11. Other Duties as required.

Community Relations Representative

- 1. Appointment by the Board of Directors on even numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Coordinate with Youth Programs, Organizations and Groups in providing archery activities in conjunction with Maya Bowhunters on our facility and off the range.
- 3. Responsible for maintaining archery equipment provided by the club for youth activities.
- 4. Maintain records of events and participation provided by Maya Bowhunters to youth groups.
- 5. Writes an article of the Club Newsletter.
- 6. Must attend monthly Club meeting.
- 7. Shall be required to be a member of CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 8. Other Duties as required

Senior Representative

- 1. Elected on odd numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Representative shall be at least 55 years of age.
- 3. Promote participation and internal relations with the senior membership and the club.
- 4. Writes an article for the Club Newsletter.
- 5. Must attend monthly Club meeting.
- 6. Shall be required to be a member of CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 7. Other Duties as required.

Range Manager

- 1. Elected on even numbered year for a term of two (2) years.
- 2. Responsible for selecting up to 3 Assistant Range Managers, under his direction.
- 3. Prioritizes maintenance of Range.
- 4. Organizes all work parties, and directs projects until completion.
- 5. Ensures that materials are on hand for all projects and work parties.
- 6. Assigns targets for maintenance.
- 7. Inspects targets bales twice each year for safety, maintenance, and general appearance.
- 8. Insures that all Maya Field and Broadhead courses pass all inspections by the NOR-CAL Regional Range Inspector and are current and up to date. Insures that the restrooms are cleaned Quarterly make visual inspection of holding tanks for damage or leaks, and add chemicals as needed. Make sure the restrooms are pumped twice a year if necessary. Inspections to be logged in monthly work party log book.
- 9. Assists VP Target in ordering repairs and replacement on all 3-D animals prior to any Invitational or 3-D Club events. This should be done in a timely manner, to insure that animals are available and ready one month prior to the event.

- 10. Responsible for the ordering and placement of target butts on the range.
- 11. Assists VP with organizing the work crews for providing the setup, and return of any 3-D animals in all Invitational or Club Shoots.
- 12. Insures that tools and equipment owned by the Club are in working order and maintained for use on the range at all times. Keeps an accurate inventory of tools, equipment, and material.
- 13. Writes an article for Club Newsletter.
- 14. Must attend monthly Board and Club meetings.
- 15. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 16. Other Duties as required.

Assistant Range Manager

- 1. Appointment subject to approval by the Board of Directors.
- 2. Assist under the Range Managers direction any projects, maintenance, or work parties.
- 3. Assume the Range Manager's duties in his absence.
- 4. Must attend monthly Club meeting.
- 5. Shall be required to be a member of CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 6. Other Duties as required.

Past President

- 1. Automatically serves a term of one (1) year after the completion of the term of President.
- 2. Works with the President and Board in an advisory position.
- 3. May attend monthly Board and Club meetings.
- 4. Shall be required to be a member of CBH and Nor Cal Region.

Election of Officers

- Nominations for officers will be accepted during the October and November, General Membership Meeting for the office(s) term that will expire at the end of the year (December).
- 2. Election of nominated officers will be held during the December General Membership Meeting.
- 3. Newly elected Officers will assume their duty beginning January of the New Year.
- 4. Any Officer or appointed position will lose their nonpaying dues status if they fail to perform their duties as outlined in the Constitution and Bylaws or if they vacate their office.

Board Members

- 1. A Board Member must be a Maya member for 2 years prior to taking office.
- 2. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH, and Nor Cal Region.
- 3. Must attend monthly Board and Club meetings.
- 4. Other Duties as required

Appointed Officers

- 1. Appointed Officers maybe appointed by Board per Article 4 in Constitution for a term not to exceed 1 year.
- 2. Required to be a member in good standing, actively involved in club activities.
- 3. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 4. Must attend monthly Board and Club meetings.
- 5. Other Duties as required.

Elected Board Members

- 1. Three (3) additional Board Members will be elected on even number years for a term of (2) vears.
- 2. Required to be a member in good standing, actively involved in club activities and must attend Board and Club meetings.
- 3. Shall be required to be a member of NFAA, CBH and Nor Cal Region.
- 4. Other Duties as required.

ARTICLE 2

Membership Requirements: Club Rules, Credits, & Dues.

Annual membership shall be granted upon payment of dues and fulfillment of requirements, including no Fish and Wildlife Violations

- **a.** All Members must participate in one (1) work party, and one (1) special event to meet the equivalent of 12 hours of work per year.
 - i. Life Members are exempt.
 - **ii.** Associates are exempt from working the 'Around the World' and 'Awesome Stickbow Classic' special events.
 - **iii.** Board of Directors can wave work requirements for members with physical disabilities or other factors.
 - iv. Members 70 years and older will not be required to attend the 2 yearly mandated work parties.
 - v. Members choosing Non participation of one work party and one special event will result in an additional fee of \$60 per mandatory work party and \$60 for the special event, with a maximum of \$120 additional fees due with next year's renewal.

Memberships

If a person wishes to join the club, they must submit a membership application at the beginning of the General Member Meeting on the First (1st) Tuesday of each Month at 7:00 pm. Membership applications can be picked up at the Maya Archer's Club House, Sportsmen's Warehouse and Wilderness Archery Shop or on our Website (MayaArchers.com).

- 1-2. SINGLE ADULT (18 years and over) or FAMILY MEMBERSHIP (Head of household, married with dependents).
 - **a.** Annual dues shall be One Hundred and Twenty dollars (\$120).
 - **b.** Credit can be earned for dues reduction as outlined in Work Party Credits in subparagraph A. B. C.
 - **c.** The maximum credit which can be earned is Eighty dollars (\$80) applied towards regular dues.
- 3. **NON WORKING ADULT/FAMILY MEMBERSHIP** shall be Two Hundred and Forty dollars (\$240) per year.
 - **d.** Exempt from mandatory work party and special event.

- 4 **YOUTH MEMBERSHIP** (17 years of age and under) shall be Fifty dollars (\$50) annually or a minimum of Twenty dollars (\$20) with approved work party credits. One Youth membership shall apply to all youth in the same household.
 - a. Youth members must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian or Youth Activity Officer at the work party.
 - b. For safety reasons no one under the age of 16 shall be allowed to use any power tools, i.e. mowers, weed eaters, saws, drills etc.
- 5. **SENIOR MEMBERSHIP /SENIOR FAMILY** are offered to any person fifty five (55) years of age before membership is due. Annual dues shall be Forty dollars (\$40). Credit can be earned for dues reduction to a maximum of Twenty dollars (\$20) under Work Party Credits in Sub paragraphs A. B. C.
- 6. **ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP** shall be Forty dollars (40) to any Adult living 50 mile radius or more from the range in Roseville. Work Party Credits can be earned for dues reduction to a maximum of Twenty dollars (\$20) under the Work Party Credits in Sub paragraphs A. B. C.
 - a. ACTIVE MILITARY and FULL TIME STUDENT shall fall under this classification.
 - b. Exempt from mandatory work party and special event work.
- 7. **LIFE Membership** may be granted by the Board of Directors to any person or family for dedicating his/her time and energy over a period of years and outstanding services rendered to this club.

Annual Dues:

- 1. Annual dues shall be payable on the first of July of each membership year along with any penalties assessed.
- 2. Any member who is delinquent in payment of dues or fees will not be eligible to vote, receive any trophies, or awards for club activities, nor receive their Club Newsletter.
- 3. Any member, who is forty five (45) days late in payment of dues, will be considered delinquent and dropped from the active club membership, until full payment of dues is received.
- 4. To reinstate club membership the member shall pay their full annual dues and any assessed penalties while forfeiting all credits earned during the previous membership year.
 - a. A dropped delinquent member cannot rejoin the club as a new member; they will be issued their original membership number.
 - b. Members who join at the March thru June meeting will be exempt one time only from the 'Around the World Shoot', but will need to complete the mandatory work- party requirements.
- 5. Membership Dues for <u>New Members</u> or previous members absent for 18 months or more are prorated in the schedule below:

6. All New members will receive a copy of Maya Constitution and Bylaws.

Work Party Credits:

- **A.** When available members may choose Target Lane maintenance instead of work parties. Maximum work credits will be given per membership.
 - 1. Targets will be inspected every 3 months.
 - 2. Every 6 months will be considered equal to \$40 work credits.
 - 3. Failure to maintain Target Lane maintenance will result in loss of \$40 work credits per 6 months.
 - 4. Members must participate in 1 mandatory work party and either the Stickbow or Around the World Shoot.
 - 5. President, Vice President and Range manager will be responsible for assessment and establishing guidelines.
- B. A credit of Ten dollars (\$10.00) shall be allowed for each Work Party, consisting of :
 - 1. A work day shall consist of six (6) hours of honest labor performed as designated by the Range Manager or approved assistant. Work may be on a scheduled workday at the range or completed during the week.
 - 2. Exceptions to duration less than 6 hours are to be determined by the Range Manager or Officer in charge and noted in work party log.
 - 3. Members reporting for a Work Party which has been previously schedule and cancelled per the club without notice shall receive credit for showing up.
 - 4. The member is solely responsible for insuring that they have personally signed and inserted their membership number legibly on the Work Party list to receive credit.
 - 5. Adult or Family membership may earn a maximum credit of Eighty dollars (\$80) per year. Senior and Associate membership may earn a maximum credit of Twenty dollars (\$20) per year. Youth membership may earn a work credit total of \$30.
- **C.** A credit of Ten dollars (\$10) shall be allowed for working the Maya 'Around the World', 'Awesome Stick bow Classic', Youth Archery Activities. Guidelines for earning this credit will be the same as Work Party credits (6 hours).
- **D.** A credit of Ten dollars (\$10) shall be allowed for participation in Special Projects as directed by the Board. These may be for participating in any project which is for the good of the club. Special Project work shall consist of any work assigned by the Board that is not part a regular Work Party.

ARTICLE 3

GENERAL CLUB RULES

1. Entrance gate to the range is to remain locked at all times, except during club meetings, work parties, or club sponsored functions open to the public (leagues, Invitational Shoots, Youth Program, and Club Shoots). The gate combination is not to be disclosed to anyone! The only entrance into the club and/or range is through the main gate, any other entrances used can mean a call to local law enforcement for removal and possible loss of membership.

- 2. Members are required to have their "Membership Card" visible while using club facilities.
- 3. Driving off the main roads is prohibited. Park in established areas only. General Parking is permitted at the clubhouse and on the left side of road heading toward the range, near the outhouse on the left side past the cable, or by the BBQ cinderblock outhouse. Members are only allowed to drive or park beyond the overpass when they are placing targets for Leagues, Invitational Shoots, or Club Shoots. Members are not allowed to park beyond the cable during Shoots. When the cable is up parking is allowed on both sides of the road before the cable, in the open area for turn around. Speed limit is10-15 M.P.H. or slow enough as to not stir up the dust on the road.
- 4. Please remember the bike trail may have riders at any time. Never point or appear to point an arrow in the direction of the bike trail or Roseville Parkway. Nock an arrow and draw your bow only while pointing AT THE TARGET in an established target lane. The act of pointing the bow skyward at an angle well above the target while drawing back the string is call 'High' or 'Sky' drawing. This is very dangerous and not allowed on any archery range. Shooters who make this movement while drawing the bow back will be asked to stop shooting until they can draw their bow back while pointing at the target or slightly above the target. Violations of this dangerous movement could result in loss of membership.
- 5. All pets must be on a leash at all times while on the range property.
- 6. Use of Crossbows, Firearms, Air Guns, and Paintball guns are strictly prohibited on the range.
- 7. No shooting at a target butt from outside of an established lane or sight in range. Never shoot across established target lane, and not beyond the furthest marker.
 - a. Maya board members in charge of tournaments, leagues, and educational classes may deviate/modify/add shooting lanes for the purpose of those events only. All safety guidelines from NFAA will be followed that may include closing parts of existing ranges until those sessions are ended and cleared. Reference Article 4, Shoots and events.
- 8. Broadheads are never to be shot into target butts. Broadheads are only allowed on the practice range. Either in the sand pits or on your own 3D target, on either side of the bales, NOT IN FRONT OF THE BALES.
- 9. The Practice Range (target butts behind the clubhouse) can be used for practice, making adjustments to equipment and training where more than 4 arrows could be shot at targets. Be aware of other shooters and the number of arrows you shoot so as to not hold up other members when they may be shooting fewer arrows.

The Field Course Range (walking course on the east side property) is designed to shoot 4 arrows per unit and moving on to the next target lane to allow other member to shoot the course. Continuous practice or shooting more than 4 arrows per unit is prohibited. Follow the National Field Archery Association (NFAA) guidelines for shooting the field course.

- a. Exceptions: Target Lane #11 has approved yardage markers beyond the official NFAA field course design. You can use this target lane similar to the Practice Range except when a member is shooting the field course you must stop shooting and let them shoot through.
- b. A unit is of a particular NFAA target face shot on 14 individual shooting lanes. The 14 shooting lanes will have the official NFAA target faces that include Field, Hunter, and Animal. On some lanes the Field and Animal target faces may be on the same target butt. Some shooting lanes will have more than one target face of the same design such as 2 field target faces especially on the shorter yardages. Still only shoot 4 arrows per unit following the above mentioned guidelines.
- 10. No littering or dumping on the range. The dumpster or trash cans are for club use only.
- 11. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES allowed on club property. This is a City of Roseville Lease Requirement and violations will result in termination of the Club's Lease.

- 12. It is the responsibility of all members to report immediately to a club officer or appropriate authority anyone under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or other intoxicating substances. Appropriate action will be taken to remove the individual /member from the facilities.
- 13. Smoking of any kind; including smokeless or artificial is prohibited on all Maya Bowhunters of Roseville Inc., property leased from the City of Roseville.
- 14. Please remember our club is family oriented and for all ages. Profanity and inappropriate behavior is unacceptable.
- 15. To hunt, harass, or discharge an arrow at any animal or bird is strictly prohibited. Violators will be reported to the Department of Fish and Wildlife, and the City of Roseville Police Department and immediate termination of Club Membership.
- 16. Use of pesticides and/or weed killers is prohibited, except as allowed by City of Roseville. These may adversely impact the monitoring program the City is performing on the closed landfill.
- 17. Cutting trees and vegetation is prohibited. Target lane clean-up consisting of mowing grass and "weed-eating" is acceptable.
- 18. Guest Policy:
 - a. In order to introduce new prospective members we will allow Members to bring guests. Member is responsible for his/her guest actions while using the range.
 - b. Member and guest must sign and date our Liability Release form. Guest must also submit \$5.00 range use fee per visit. These must be placed in the locked box located by the door of the clubhouse.
 - c. Members must accompany his/her guest at all times while on the range. Members and guests are responsible for following all Club Rules and any violations will be subject for review by the Board of Directors.

Violation of any Maya General Club Rules will be subject to review by Board of Directors. The consequences will be decided at that time. Termination of membership without refund of dues is an option.

ARTICLE 4

Shoots and Events

All shoots are subject to change with prior notification and approval of the board.

Section I: Official Club Shoots

- 1. This shoot is to be held on the second Sunday of each month and will be the Official Club Shoot. Starting time to be 9:00 a.m. during the winter and 8:00 a.m. in the summer.
- 2. All scores will be recorded by the club's Class Secretary in the club shoot record book and newsletter.
- 3. Only Maya members may shoot for club awards and pins. Club win pins and NFAA pins and/or awards if eligible will be issued for this shoot only.
- 4. Club win pins will be given to all scratch winners in each style and classes. The style and class will follow NFAA guidelines. In the case of a tie the shooter with the most x's will get a win pin.
- 5. Club shoot fees for: Adult members \$2. Youth & Cub members \$1. Guest Adult \$4. Guest Youth & Cub \$2.

Section II: Maya Open 'Around the World' Shoot (Guests Only)

- 1. This shoot is a guest only shoot.
- 2. This shoot will consist of Forty Two (42) targets.
- 3. Awards will be presented at the end of the shoot.

Section III: Maya Club 3D Championship (Members Only)

- 1. This shoot date is to be determined by the board.
- 2. This shoot will coincide with the Maya Open 'Around the World' shoot, with the same targets and scoring.
- 3. Awards will be for the top shooter in each style and class.
- 4. Awards are for members only.
- 5. Awards will be given out at the Annual Awards Dinner.
- 6. Awards will be designed and approved by the Board of Directors

Section IV: Maya Club Championship (Members Only)

- 1. This shoot will be held on the official club shoot day in October. It will be recorded as official NFAA type shoot and scores will be posted on the NFAA card.
- 2. Maya members must have participated in a minimum of three (3) club monthly functions in the past dues year to be eligible for an award. This may be a mixture of monthly work parties, and or monthly meetings. Members who join the club in less than two months prior to a tournament or special shoot must have participated in at least one Club activity, monthly club shoot, work party or club meeting to be eligible for an award.
- 3. This shoot will consist of 14 field, 14 hunter, and 14 animal targets. Awards will be given to the winner in each style and class.
- 4. All participants will shoot in groups with the same style and class.
- 5. No club awards will be issued at this shoot. Championship awards will be given out at the Annual Awards Dinner. Awards shall be in the form of a belt buckle whenever possible. If not possible then awards will be designed and approved by the Board of Directors.

Section V: Maya Flashlight and Picnic (Members Only)

- 1. This shoot will be scheduled at the Boards discretion.
- 2. The shoot will consist of 14 targets shot after dark. Target scoring will be left to the person that is running the shoot. No distances over 30 yards will be used. No flashlight over a 2 D cell handheld type may be used. Only one flashlight at a time will be on per shooting group.
- 3. Awards to be given out at the Annual Awards Dinner. Awards to be designed and approved by Board of Directors. Awards will be of a novelty type.

Section VI: Maya Trail Shoot (Members Only)

- 1. This shoot will be scheduled at the Boards discretion.
- 2. This will be a two person scored event. Shooting partners will be drawn at random after shooting is completed. In the event of an odd number of participants, odd person out will receive their score by the luck of the draw.
- 3. Rules of the course to be set up on yearly basis by either the President or Vice President. (Whoever runs the shoot).
- 4. All targets will be 3-D with unknown yardages. The course will be run with a time limit. The winner will be the team with the best combined score. In the event of tie winner will be determined by the luck of the draw.
- 5. Awards to be designed and approved by the Board of Directors. Award will be given at the Annual Awards Dinner.

Section VII: Broadhead Championship (Members Only)

- 1. The Broadhead Championship will be held in the final week of the Broadhead League.
- 2. Course will consist of 14 3-D animal targets at unmarked/marked yardages. Must use broadhead tipped arrows only.

3. Awards will be given to the top shooter in all styles. Young adults will shoot as adults. No awards other than broadhead shoot awards will be issued. Awards will be given out at the Annual Club Awards Dinner. Awards will be designed and approved yearly by the Board of Directors.

Section VIII: Indoor League (Members Only)

- 1. To be held at an indoor range chosen by the Board. To start in the month of October.
- 2. Rules and length of shoot (multiple events) to be setup by and approved by the Board on a yearly basis.
- 3. Awards will be given out at the Annual Awards Dinner. Awards to be designed and approved by the Board of Directors.

Section IX: Summer League (Optional)

- 1. The Summer League is an independent league and covers its own expenses, awards and rules. This league is open to all shooters and is to be shot scratch in all styles.
- 2. Rules and length of shoot (multiple events) to be setup by and approved by the Board on a yearly basis.

Section X: Polar Bear League (Optional)

- 1. The Polar Bear League is an independent league and covers its own expenses, awards, and rules. This league is open to all shooters and is to be shot scratch in all styles.
- 2. Rules and length of shoot (multiple events) to be setup by and approved by the Board on a yearly basis.

Section XI: Broadhead / 3-D League

- 1. The Broadhead / 3-D League are independent leagues and covers its own expenses, awards and rules. This league is open to all shooters and is to be shot scratch in all styles.
- 2. Rules and length of shoot (multiple events) to be setup by and approved by the Board on a yearly basis.

Section XII: Other Shoots and Events

1. These will be held as often as the club sees fit. Rules and awards of these shoots will be set on a yearly basis.

Section XIII: Annual Awards Dinner (Members and their guests)

1. Dinner quality type banquet to be held in March of each year to honor Maya members and handout the special shoot and hunting awards.

Section XIV: Toys for Tots Shoot

- 1. The Toys for Tots shoot will be held on the first Sunday in December. This is a charity shoot thus entry fees will be a new unwrapped toy to be given to the Toy for Tots drive.
- 2. Score cards will be issued upon request, but no scores will be used. This is strictly a fun shoot for a great cause.

Section XV: Awesome Stick bow Classic

- 1. The Awesome Stick bow Classic will be held on the first Sunday in November. The Vice President will be responsible for this shoot. The rules will be setup on a yearly basis.
- 2. The shoot will consist of at least 30, 3-D unmarked targets. This is a Traditional shoot with three styles; Recurve, Longbow, and Primitive. Arrow requirements are as follows for each style.

Recurve	Aluminum or Wood Shafts Only				
Longbow	Wood Shafts Only				
Primitive	Wood Shafts Only				
All Styles	Carbon shafts are not allowed				

- 3. Novelty targets are optional on a year to year basis.
- 4. Awards will be selected on a yearly basis. Awards will be presented at the end of the shoot.
- 5. Scores will be posted in the next Club Newsletter and on the web site.

Section XVI: Educational Classes, Events, & Programs

- 1. To perpetuate Maya Bowhunters of Roseville Inc. (dba Maya Archers) purpose in furthering wise uses of the bow and arrow, educational classes, events or programs may be scheduled.
- 2. During these events, ranges and/or areas may be closed to conduct those events following NFAA safety guidelines.
- 3. Notice shall be posted to Maya Archers website under the 'Calendar' and/or 'Important Notice' section and range board to inform members of the event and closed areas as needed. Generally only one range will be affected.
- 4. Property shall be posted of area closures for the duration of the event. Areas will reopen after the events have ended and cleared.
- 5. While rare, last minute changes for safety circumstances may happen due to issues beyond our control. Changes may include relocating or timing of the event.

ARTICLE 5

Maya Tournament Awards and Awards Programs

Section I: Club Win Pins

- 1. This pin is to be given to the winner in their Style & Class at the official monthly club shoot.
- 2. After a member collects ten (10) win pins, they may turn them back to the club's Class Secretary for a Ten Win patch, pin or bar.
- 3. A person must shoot in A Class until they shoot 2 or more club shoots to establish a handicap.

Section II: NFAA Pins and Awards

- 1. All Maya members who also have a membership in NFAA may apply for any or all pins and awards that they qualify for by shooting our official Club shoot.
- 2. Maya will pay for members (with NFAA membership) first 20 Pin. Members will pay for all other pins and bars. Maya will supply order forms for the pins.
- 3. Maya will pay for a member's (with NFAA membership) first Robin Hood. Members will pay for all other pins and bars. Maya will supply order forms for the pins.

Section III: Maya Spot Program

- 1. The club's Class Secretary will keep track of all spots shot by members at official club shoots.
- 2. For Non Sight shooters the five ring or bulls' eye will constitute a spot. For Sight shooters the arrow must touch the inner ring within the five ring.

3. When a member has shot 100 spots they will be awarded a 100 spot pin. The spot awards will go 100, 500 and in 500 increments thereafter. The Spot award will be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner.

Section IV: Hunting Awards

All Hunting awards will be handed out by the Hunting VP at the Annual Awards Dinner.
 Categories of awards will be set by the Hunting VP and approved by the Board of Directors.

Section V: Club Championship Award

- 1. This award will be a belt buckle with the year inscribed on it. In the case that buckles are not available then the Board of Directors will design an appropriate award.
- 2. The award is to be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner.

Section VI: Life Membership Award

 Upon being voted to a life membership the recipient is entitled to an award designed along the Maya Emblem. Also a patch stating Life member will be presented. Award and patch will be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner.

Section VII: Special Maya Shoot Awards

- Flashlight Award This award will be designed by the Board of Directors on a yearly basis.
 This award should center on a flashlight theme. Awards to be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner.
- 2. Maya Trail Shoot This award will be designed by the Board of Directors on a yearly basis. Awards to be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner.
- 3. Maya Broadhead Award This award will be the shape of a broadhead. This award will be designed by the Board of Directors on a yearly basis. Award to be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner.
- 4. Maya Club 3-D Championship shoot awards This award will be designed by the Board of Directors on a yearly basis. Awards to be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner.
- 5. Other Awards These awards will be designed by the Board of Directors on an as needed basis.)

Section XIII: Maya Tournament Participation Program (Optional)

1. Consists of members reporting to Vice President Target all attending/participating in other Club Open Shoots, Club Shoots and Club Activities for annual participation award.

ARTICLE 6

CLUB FINANCES

- 1. Fixed monthly or day to day expenses identified in the Annual Budget to run the club will be paid by the treasurer.
- 2. Regular approval of non- emergency essential expenses not in the budget must be brought up at the club meeting and approved by a 2/3 majority vote.
- 3. Emergency essential purchases are considered those that can't wait until the next club meeting. Board of Directors may make emergency purchases up to \$500.
- 4. All Emergency essential purchases must be brought up at the next club meeting and be recorded in the minutes.

5.	The following officers, VP Target, Range Manager, Newsletter Editor, Secretary, Class Secretary, Community Relations Representative (Youth Archery Activities), Treasurer and any officer responsible for a program or event will each present to the Club Membership their annual budget for approval.
